In September a total of 35,467 passengers used the Airport compared with 26,725 last. The temporary passenger accommadation has been roufed over and heating units have been B.U.A. are to operate an L.B.A. Southampton service next year. C-119's of the Force Aérienne Belge.

Following the appearance of so many C-119 Packets of the Belgian Air Force at Leconfield, a few notes on the aircraft may not come amiss. The aircraft concerned are all ex U.S.A.F. machines, purchased by the U.S.A.F. in the fiscal years of 1951, 52 and 53. The original batch of twenty aircraft delivered to the F.A.B. were serialled CP-1 to CP-20 and were of the C-119F variety. The first eight of these have since been transferred to the Royal Norwegion A.F., and the remainder brought up to C-119G standard. A further batch of C-119G's were delivered and these were CP-21 to CP-46 inclusive, deliveries being completed in 1960. Serial/Code tie-ups are as follows:-

CP-4 to CP-8 incl. OT-CAA to OT-CAH incl. Transferred to R.No. A.F. CP-9 to CP-20 incl. OT-CAI to OT-CAT incl. CP-21 to CP-40 incl. OT-CBA to OT-CBT incl. CP-44 to CP-46 incl. OT-CEA to OT-CEH incl.

The following aircraft have been written off:- CP-23, CP-25, CP-36 and CP-45. The aircraft form part of 20eme Escadrille at Brussels/Maelsbrook, serving with 21 eme Sqn, (Green Sioux) and 40eme Sqn. (Blue Sioux). Originally CP-21 to CP-40 were with 21 eme Sqn., and the remainder with the 40eme Sqn. but several changes have since been made. The colour scheme is dull natural metal overall with the code on the fuselage sides and theserial on the fins and nose. The full U.S.A.F. serial and designation is painted on just below the cockpit.
