LEEDS/BRADFORD MOVEMENTS REVIEW - FEBRUARY

Conquest N441AG c/n 0327 started the month off on the 1st when it visited Northair. The only French visitor was King Air C90 F-BXAP on the 7th. Aer Lingus slipped in a couple of BAC 1-11's on the daily service, EI-ANG on the 10th and EI-ANG on the 12th. Night stopping on the 11th was the Delta FH227 00-DTA and night stopping on the 14th was Cessna T303 N9959C. Cessna 340A N8752K arrived on the 16th to be based and it is operated for Audi cars. c/n is 0639 and it is probably to remain US registered. The 22nd was busy with Aerostar 00-MRF being joined by Aztecs OY-DZG and OY-BD@. Cessna 414A EI-DGP visited on the 23rd and another Irishman was Cessna 210 EI-BOD on the 28th. Plenty of Military stuff this month, Queens Flight Andover XS790 and Army Scout XV138 on the 2nd, were followed by HS 125 CC3 ZE395 on the 3rd. Another 125 CC3 was XW788 which was joined by Wessex XV720 on the 13th. A third 125 CC3 was logged on the 14th when ZD703 diverted in from Linton. The US Navy visited with C-12 161503 on the 17th and the US Army with U-21 18013 on the 23rd. The Queens Flight Andover XS789 reportedly went u/s on the 21st and Wessex XV732 came in to effect repairs. Star UK registration of the year must have been Boeing 757 G-MOND which did the Monarch flight from and to Malaga quite comfortably on the 23rd. Noel Edmunds has changed his Jetranger for Squirrel G-NOEI which visited on the 18th. Big day for diversions inbound was the 14th, with an interesting one being the Loganair Viscount G-AOHM. On the local scene VP-2 G-BEFV which has been built in the centre of Yeadon was moved to the Airport on the 11th for the final assembly and checks for a permit to fly. Duchess G-BGRG left for Cranfield on the 16th and was replaced on the same day by Cessna T303 G-BKXG. Cessna 441 G-BLCL arrived at Northair on the 22nd and departed to Luton via Gamston & Heathrow on the 24th. Cessna 404 G-BHNH was painted up as G-DAFS on the 17th for the Dept. of Agriculture, Fisheries Service and may remain based here, YLA have been advertising for Cessna 150's in any condition and on the 9th the remains of G-ATND/AWES/CJVH arrived in a removal van. Aztec EI-BOK is still present and has not yet flown in these marks.

AIR COMMUTER have confirmed the purchase of HS.748 VR-CBH ex. Cayman Airways and one time G-BEKG of Dan Air. It is undergoing a £100,000 refurbish at Dan Air Engineering, Manchester and is due to enter service in early April. The refit will include a new wide body look with 33 first class seats and a complete repaint in the new Air Commuter colour scheme.

AIR ECOSSE have had the 15 seat capacity restriction on its Aberdeen-Glasgow service lifted by the CAA, therefore allowing them to use larger aircraft on their through services to Belfast and Dublin. It has been reported that they are to return Shorts 3-30 G-BGNA to Manx and lease ex. Inter City Shorts 3-30 G-BITV from the manufacturers.

AIR UK are to commence a Stansted - Edinburgh service with two flights in each direction per wookday, exact route details have not been released. The Stansted-Amsterdam is to be increased to four flights per day Mon-Fri, both service changes to commence in April. The airline have also applied to the CAA to operate Stansted-Brussels and revoke JEA's licence which at present is not being used. In addition to the charters to be operated for TTS Tours from LEA, as mentioned in the February magazine, they are also operating from Eirmingham to Bergen.

BRITISH AIRWAYS are to start serving Miami by Concorde from 27th March, it will be as an extension of the LHR-Washington service. Application for a licence to operate LHR-Riyadh and plans to recommence LHR-Teheran have been lodged.

BRITISH CALEDONIAN are planning to operate LCW-New York from April 1985 and are prepared to offer a limited number of seats at £50 one way. This has upset Virgin Atlantic Airways. The Airbus A310's G-BKWT/U are due for delivery 2/84 and 3/84 respectively. The airline has sold B.707 G-BDEA to Angola Airways and leased BAC 1-11 G-AXLL via B.Ae from Faucett, this aircraft was once operated from new by BMA. A licence to serve Doha, Muscat, Abu Dhabi and Dubai as terminating points has been applied for. At present they are stops on the Far East services.

BRITISH ISLAND AIRWAYS have bought two ex. Cayman Airways BAC 1-11's to be delivered 4/84 and 5/84.

BIRMINGHAM EXECUTIVE have applied to the CAA for a licence to operate Birmingham-Stuttgart, Stockholm and Geneva.

AIRLINE REVIEW (Contd)

BRITISH MIDIAND AIRWAYS have had a second Short 3-60 delivered to operate EMA-Heathrow and are also considering the purchase of further Shorts aircraft. Heathrow-Belfast services are due to start on March 26th with seven flights each weekday and four flights on a weekend. It is reported that the airline has work for four B.707 aircraft this summer, mainly on transatlantic flights, so extra aircraft will have to be brought in.

BROWN AIR SERVICES have applied to operate LBA-OSLO using Cessna 441 G-MOXY. Apparently they fly regularly to Oslo for their own employees so have decided to operate commercially!!

BRYMON have commenced operations on the Exeter- Gatwick route following Air UK's withdrawal.

DAN AIR SERVICES It is all change on the B737 front for this summer with only G-EJXJ and G-EKNH the same aircraft as last year. The three other aircraft are G-ILFC (ex. G-BOSL), G-BJXL (ex. Air Europe / Air Florida) and G-BLDE(ex. 4X-BAC Arkia), The airline have commenced operations on Gatwick-Belfast, using BAC 1-11 400's, after EMA's withdrawal.

EUROFLITE have applied for a licence to operate Luton-Rotterdam/Amsterdam and objected to the Luton International Airways applications. The airline have re-introduced a second daily (Mon-Fri) service on the Luton-Brussels route. Bandeirante G-BKWB is to be sold but it is not stated which aircraft is to replace it.

GENAIR have applied for Blackpool/Humberside to Manchester licence plus Liverpool/Manchester to Londonderry.

JANUS are reported to have purchased the three ex. Inter City Viscounts G-ARGR, G-ARIR, and G-BDRC. Two of the aircraft are to be put into service with the other as back up and the Herald G-ATIG. Up to four flights per day, witheach aircraft visiting, are planned from Coventry to Ostend/Beauvais from May 1984.

LOGANAIR Friendship G-IOMA suffered a bad landing at Manchester in January and they have leased ex. BAF Viscount G-AOHM with Loganair titles.

LUTON INTERNATIONAL AIRWAYS a new airline that has applied to operate Luton-Rotterdam / Amsterdam in opposition to Euroflite, aircraft to be used quoted as Viscounts in 65 seat configuration.

MANX AIRLINES have applied to operate Birmingham-IOM twice daily with rail connections at Birmingham to London.

MONARCH the plans for aircraft disposal for the summer season are as follows:2-B737 and 2-BAC 1-11 at Luton, 1-B737 and 2-B757 at Gatwick, 1-B737 and 1-B757
at Manchester and 1-B737 at Glasgow. It is anticipated that B737 G-BJSO and the
two BAC 1-11's will be painted in the new colour scheme for the commencement of
the summer season.

METROPOLITAN AIRWAYS are rumoured to be taking over Glasgow-LBA-Cardiff-Bristol service from April 1984, possibly with a Short 3-30. DHC 6 Twin Otter G-BELS has been sold to Mount Cook Airlines as ZK-MCO and ex. Aurigny G-BIMW has been leased in Metro titles.

SPACEGRAND have applied to operate Birmingham-IOM/Belfast Harbour and also to the proposed new STOL port in London's Dockland. They have also applied for a Blackpool Manchester licence.

VIRGIN ATLANTIC AIRWAYS is the new name for British Atlantic Airways, since a large input of money from the owners of Virgin Records. They are competing with BCAL from Gatwick to New York, but to Newark Airport not JFK. They are prepared to match the fares set by People Express or BCAL if they are given licence to operate from June 1984.

A Trip North of the Borders 14th - 18th September 1983 (Contd.)

There were other places calling, so with everything logged we left Leuchars for Perth. This caused untold trouble, the RAF marshallers had to stop all incoming traffic for us!
