LBA MOVEMENTS REVIEW - APRIL 1986

Slightly better than last month, but only just. On the 3rd we had Aztec F-BVJK and on the 4th Citation PH-MRX night-stopped. The McCain Foods Westwind C-GRDP visited on the 7th and Cessna 441 SE-IBM night-stopped on the same day. Cessna 401 00-RWG which visited on the 11th is a fairly regular sight, Uni-Air F-27 F-BIUK also arrived on the 11th as UF410 and departed on the 13th as UF411. Cessna Chancellor D-IBCK was night-stopping on the 15th. Two less common visitors on the 17th were Cessna 421C LX-ETA and the newly registered Citation II LN-AAD. Navajo SE-IDU night-stopped from the 22nd to the 25th. Two new registrations on the 23rd were Aer Lingus's new Short 360 EI-BSP and Navajo SE-FAY. Chancellor HB-LMF brought in some local visitors on the 27th and stayed until the 29th. Last foreigner of the month was the Beech A36TC N206WJ which is based in Spain. On the 19th the Tiger Moth G-ANON visited calling itself 'Tiger T7909' and was joined by Bell 222 G-BLSY which was a first visit of type. Night-stopping on the 29th was Cherokee Arrow G-BMOP c/n 28R-7703194 ex N38257, on delivery from Reykjavik to Shoreham. The Military have been active this month with Beaver XP820/Army 116 on the 21st, Beaver XP769/Army 351 on the 29th and Wasp XT793/Navy 456 on the 25th. At Northair the Cessna 441 G-BLCZ is now painted in the colours of Evans of Leeds and replaces the other Cessna 441 G-EVNS. Cessna 421C G-BHKJ returned from Pakistan, where it is on lease to the UN, on the 3rd for its annual check. It left again on the 12th. Cessna 340A G-EMAM was delivered from Brussels on the 23rd and is still present, the significance of the registration is not known. The usual Jetstreams and Dominies on the ILS were not alone this month. VC-10 XV104/ASCOT 862 was noted on the 7th and VC-10 XV101 used the same callsign on the 28th. Gazelle XZ930/SYN55 was on the ILS on the 11th.

The Frankfurt and Oslo routes were operated by Peregrine King Air G-WWHL from the 08th to 13th due to Conquest G-MOXY being engaged on charter work. British Air Ferries transported delegates to a conference with Viscounts G-AOYL VF8610P/8610 Aberdeen - Jersey on the 11th and G-AOYG VF8611/8612 Jersey - Southend on the 13th. Air UK had two problems in the month with unserviceable Friendships which allowed British Island Airways One-Eleven G-CBIA to operate UK217Q on the 16th Edinburgh - Gatwick and their own of the type G-AXOX routing Amsterdam - Edinburgh UK551Q on the 23rd. Friendship G-BCDN operated UK020/2012 t/f Frankfurt on the 27th to collect the party who had departed two days earlier in the Orion Airways Boeing 737! British Midland used DC-9 G-BMAG on the 17th BD416/336 Heathrow - Teesside in lieu of the One-Eleven, and Interflight's Cessna 404 substituted for the Shorts 330 on WG744 Gatwick - Humberside on the 15th. FOR THE FIRST TIME

The opening of LBA's new runway, 33/15, in 1965 enabled a variety of larger aircraft to use the airport for the first time. Starting with the British built airliners we can trace the Avro 748 back to 1961 when the Prototype G-APZV appeared at the annual air display on 22/5. Following that brief visit it was 30/9/62 before BKS brought in G-ARMW, which they had leased from Skyways to do the LBA/LHR flights. The first military 748 was the Queens Flight XS789 which did a proving flight from and to Benson on 31/3/65 in preparation for a visit by Her Majesty the following day. BUA started services to the Isle of Man with Heralds and the first was G-APWH noted on 27/11/62. The first Viscount visit was on 14/5/64 when the Starways aircraft G-AMOC did a proving flight. Towards the end of its career the Airspeed Ambassador appeared on the EKS routes through LBA starting with G-AMAD on 3/5/65. The first BAC 1-11 was brought in by Aer Lingus on 9/3/66 when EI-ANE brought Leeds United back from Budapest. The big brother of the Viscount, the Vanguard, was used by Invicta on 14/1/74 in the shape of G-AZRE which took a cargo of 129 pigs to Zagreb via Stansted. Shorts 360 G-BKKT of Genair made the types debut at LBA by accident when it diverted in from Humberside on 30/4/83. VC-10 A40-AB was on a medevac flight on 4/3/85 when it became the first one to visit. Moving on to Holland the F-27 was introduced by Aer Lingus on the Dublin route back on 1/4/62 with EI-AKA. Appropriately enough the F-27 in military guise was first used at the LBA by the Dutch A/F with C-2 (PECAB) on 14/5/64. The Dutch Royal Flight brought in the first F-28 PH-MBX on 6/12/72. Canadian airliners were represented here by Argonaut G-ALHG which started on the EMA to Glasgow route with BMA on 14/4/65, and Canadair CL44J EI-BGO which Aer Turas used on a horse charter on 21/8/85. Plus the DHC7 OE-HLS which called on delivery to Tyrolean on 25/3/80. France's contribution was Caravelle PH-TRH of Transavia which started flights to the Dutch bulb fields on 28/4/74. One of the rarest types must be the Japanese built YS-11 LN-MTA of Mey-Air which brought in a team of archers from Scandinavia for a contest in York on 25/7/71. The largest contingent of types comes of course from the USA, most of the Boeing types are new to the LBA recently except for the 737 which was another first for Aer Lingus on 15/9/70 with ET-ASC. Convair 440 N400J was not in fact an airline version but an executive model belonging to Johnson and Johnson when it visited on 5/9/61. Curtiss C-46 LN-FOP of Fred Olsen was used during the dock strike of 1970 when on 18/7 it was F/T Stansted. The dock strike brought in several new types including the Hercules N9227R which took out 19.5 tons of freight on 29/7 and Constellation F-BGNG from Mimes to Orly on 25/7.

The Connie was the first civil one but it was preceded by the US Air Force VC121A 48-0611 of 1245ATW which arrived on 24/4/66 and stayed two days. Douglas types have also been seen here with C-54 KX-1 (OTCWU) of the Belgian A/F on 25/1/63 just beating the first civil C-54 PH-MAE of Martins Air Charter which was on 1/5/64. Martins also brought in the first DC7 which was PH-DSL, this arrived over the LBA beacon on 4/6/65 at 0755 and steamed around in the fog until 0910 in company with a BMA Argonaut. The first DC9 was also Martinair when PH-MAO was from Liverpool to Amsterdam on 29/12/70. Moving on to the biz-jets we find the DH125 G-ASTY on 12/10/6 and the military versionXW791 on 17/4/73. Lear Jet N706L was from Lyons to Geneva when it came in for demonstration flights on 30/1/66. Falcon 20 (then called a Mystere 20) HB-VAV was from Ringway to Hannover on 19/5/67. Gulfstream II N179T was LHR to Edinburgh on 26/2/71, whilst Gulfstream III F-GDHK was the Aga Khans personal aircraft on 11/9/82. Jet Commander SE-DCK was en route LHR/Zurich on 31/3/67. Jetstar M3E on 14/4/71 belonged to Cameron Iron Works and it had replaced their Fairchild F-27 M172C which was the first American built F-27 to visit on 12/4/67. These then are some of the first visits of type to LBA from my log - book. If you disagree with any of them please let us know. In the meantime we have to look forward to one or two more types yet, we seem to have missed out on the Comet and Trident but we have a chance of the DC-10 and maybe some of the Eastern Bloc airliners.

AIRLINES REVIEW - MAY 1986

Air Bridge Carriers: The E.M.A.-based cargo carrier has had its Swissair contract for Zurich - Manchester/Glasgow freight flights, using Merchantman aircraft, renewed for another year.

Ace Aviation: Glasgow-based Ace Aviation has changed its operating title to Ace Scottish European Airways following the approval to operate regional services. It requires two aircraft in order to meet the planned starting date in June 1986 for scheduled services from Glasgow to Brussels and Hamburg. Equipment may be leased and current favourite appears to be the Brasilia as the Jetstream 31 is said to be too small, while the B.Ae.748 or Saab 340 are too big. Negotiations were still continuing recently for the route Glasgow-Gothenburg.

AIR UK:- The airline has had its Stansted-Southampton request approved, but its Exeter-Paris (CDG) licence has been revoked following an appeal by J.E.A. New applications have been made for the routes Stansted-Jersey, and Stansted-Geneva/Milan/Zurich.

Aviation West: The Bristol - based company is to operate a Trislander service from Exeter to Alderney and Cherbourg this Summer on Sundays.

AIRLINES REVIEW (Contd.)

British Airways:- Two former British West Indian Airways of Trinidad B.Ae. 748-347s have been leased from Euroair (see news item) to supplement the six already operated, following the takeover of some of the West German routes. They are likely to be interchanged with the Scottish fleet via a newly awarded Manchester-Munster service. Further cracks have been found below the front doors of some of the Boeing 747-100 aircraft; three are 16 years old and the remainder between 10 and 13 years old. Recently awarded new routes include Manchester-Madrid and Birmingham-Malaga, but Manchester-Malaga was not successful. Traffic rights between Hong Kong and Peking have also been lost. The Manchester - Heathrow shuttle will have an increased frequency this Summer, while the Heathrow-Baltimore Tristar 200 schedules should have become daily from 27th April. A Boeing 747-200 series Combi flight simulator has been ordered from C.A.E.Electronics of Canada for delivery in 1988. The order is part of a Sym expansion programme for the training of flight crews. The simulator will be used for conversion and type training for the airlines own 747 crews, and those of other airlines. Airtours were due to begin services at the beginning of May to Florida, Los Angeles and Toronto using the 465-seat Boeing 747-283B leased for a three year period as G-BMGS (20121), formerly LN-AEO with S.A.S. Further Trident disposals include Series 2E G-AVFK to the Metropolitan Police Training Centre at Hounslow Heath. Series 3Bs G-AWZJ to Prestwick and G-AWZU to Stansted, both for emergency services training, G-AWZN has gone to Cranfield, and G-AWZM has gone to the Science Museum collection at Wroughton. Leased Boeing 757-236 G-BKRM was due to return to Air Europe in April with whom it will remain until The state of the s October.

British Air Ferries:— A Carlisle-Jersey/Guernsey service was due to begin on 29th May and will continue until 29th September. The airline has a pooling arrangement with Crossair for its new Channel Islands-Zurich services, while the Jersey author—ities have given their support to the Southampton-Jersey application, but Aurigny did not receive similar backing. An application has been made by associate Guernsey Airlines for the route Guernsey-Amsterdam. The aircraft involved in the heavy landing at Southend, and reported last month, was Viscount 802, G-BLNB (170). The aircraft landed wheels-up on 9th March and is currently stored at Southend awaiting repair. Unconfirmed reports indicate that the airline may be planning to acquire Go-Air, the Tucson, Arizona-based Viscount operator, which recently filed for US Chapter protection.

British Caledonian Airways: Merger talks between the airline and the International Leisure Group, owners of Air Europe, were continuing at the beginning of May despite official claims that discussions concern only shared aircraft plans. The airlines have a 10 aircraft order which could form part of a deal. The airline has brought forward the start of its Gatwick-Tokyo service to 1st June routing nonstop via Siberia. It also wants to begin the Gatwick-Milan service from 1st June, while from 1st July the Gatwick-Hong Kong services will be operated three times each week by Boeing 747, and four times per week by DC-10. Following the American raid on Libya the British government instructed BCAL to indefinitely suspend its three DC-10 services each week to Tripoli. On 1st June the Gatwick-Muscat service is due to start with six flights each week. Although the airline has discontinued its commuter network with Brymon, Guernsey, B.A.F. and Crown Air Ecosse, it has stated that the network will be reactivated this Summer. An arrangement with Connectair is being maintained.

British Island Airways: The Gatwick-based charter airline is set to become the first British airline quoted on the U.K. stock market in its own right. Valued at over £11m B.T.A. expect to raise over £2m from institutional investors. The airline was formed only four years ago following a management buy-out from parent British and Commonwealth Shipping. In that time the airline has doubled its fleet to eight One-Elevens, more than doubled passenger figures and boosted pretax profits from £50,000 to this years £1.2m.

AIRLINES REVIEW (Gontd.)

British Midland Airways: The airlines two new Shorts 360s, G-EMHX/Y (SH.3687/8) were due in May, allowing the transfer of sisterships G-EMAJ/R to Manx Airlines. A third aircraft is on order for Loganair to replace one leased from Shorts. Approval has been obtained for the Heathrow-Amsterdam schedule and up to five daily flights may operate using DC-9 aircraft, starting on 29th June. B.M.A. wants to expand its European services and is studying the possibility of creating a new airline to do this. The order for five ATP aircraft has been confirmed, with the first aircraft due to be delivered to Manx in September 1987. Two will operate with Manx on the I.O.M./Liverpool-Heathrow services, one will go to Loganair, the remaining two to B.M.A.

City Air: A recently formed operator, City Air has made applications for the routes Stolport-Paris (CDG), Amsterdam, Antwerp, Gatwick-Lugano, Luton - Manchester and Liverpool-Manchester. Earlier applications pending are Luton/Liverpool-Dublin. A leased Shorts 3-30 is to be used.

Crown Air Ecosse: From first April three new routes were introduced and and five others relaunched, together with a new livery. The fleet continues to be five Short 330s with a six aircraft required for later this year. Routes are as follows: EMA-Edinburgh-Aberdeen, twice daily, Gatwick-Teesside, twice daily, Monday-Friday, and via L.B.A. on Saturday and Sunday, while L.B.A. is also served Monday-Friday, twice daily on a Gatwick-LEA-Humberside-Gatwick schedule. Air UK have been replaced on the Teesside-Humberside-Esbjerg service which operates daily, Monday-Friday. Other routes operated by Shorts 330 aircraft are Belfast-Glasgow-Aberdeen-Wick return, Dublin-Glasgow-Aberdeen (a.m.) and Aberdeen-Glasgow-Dublin (p.m.). A Titan is used to operate the route Wick-Aberdeen-Wick, Monday-Friday, twice daily, and a Casair Titan is used on the service Humberside-Teesside-Glasgow, twice daily, Monday-Friday, while a Euroair Bandeirante operates Aberdeen-Dundee-Manchester, Monday-Friday, twice daily, with a Sunday afternoon only service of Aberdeen-Dundee-Manchester, The Gatwick-Norwich service is operated twice daily, Monday - Friday, also by a Cessna Titan.

Dan Air: The airline is imposing strict cost controls following the publication of the 1985 Davis and Newman trading results. An overall loss would have occured had it not been for the £1.3m realised from the sale of surplus aircraft. The Airbus A300B4 leased from Hapag Lloyd is to be registered G-BMNA and is formerly D-AHLJ (169). The aircraft is operating in a basic Hapag Lloyd livery with Dan Air titles. Also leased is Boeing 727-264 N728ZV (20710) from Aeron International Airlines in full Dan Air livery, but currently retaining its American registration.

Euroair: - The CAA has granted the airline a licence to operate advance booking charters between Luton and Jersey this Summer. However the application for Stairsted-Jersey ABCs was not successful. The series of charters is limited to 1488 seats and not 2976 as requested. Fares must be purchased at least 21 days in advance and the minimum stay is seven days. Euroair states that its break-even load factor is 66% based on a proposed return fare of £69. The application was unsuccessfully challenged by B.M.A., J.E.A. and British Airways. The airline has purchased Janus Airways from Hards Travel and is using the Janus Herald together with various Dan Air 748 aircraft, on mail flights from Liverpool, and Luton-Glasgow. The B.Ae 748 leased to Tunisavia, G-BWFT, has returned to the UK and is used on the Glasgow-Luton-E.M.A.-Edinburgh mail flights and is available for Adhoc charters. Additionally, two Heralds, G-AVPN and G-BEYK have been leased from Nordic Air leasing, one being used on the Birmingham-Hannover cargo service, releasing the Elan Herald which now operates the Amsterdam cargo service from E.M.A. A contract was signed in mid-April with B.W.I.A. of Trinidad for the lease purchase of two 7/3 aircraft, G-BGMN/O (1766/7), formerly 9Y-TGH/I, which it is then to lease to B.A. for use by the Highlands Division. The aircraft were both delivered early in April from Port of Spain to Exeter via San Juan, Miami, Boston, Gander, Greenland and Reykjavik for preparation by West Country Aircraft Services.

AIRLINES REVIEW (Contd.)

Jersey European Airways: - An application to serve Bournemouth-Dublin/Paris (CDG) has been successful, but the request for Bournemouth-Jersey was not. The CAA stated that the latter service was not in the interests of the user and would achieve growth only at the expense of Dan Air who currently operate the route. Similarly, the Authority stated that the Air UK services operated from Southampton to Jersey provided a satisfactory alternative to the Dan Air services from Bournemouth.

London European Airways: The airlines former Viscount 806 G-LOND has been purchased by Caicos International in the Caribbean following storage and preparation at ExeterIt is possible that the airline will restart operations between Luton and Amsterdam/Brussels using either a Shorts 330 or 360, if its finances can be restructured. It is believed that Euroair are also interested in taking over the routes.

London Express Aviation: has applied to the CAA for traffic rights from Stansted to Bangkok, starting on 1st October, and operating all year round, once weekly. The application follows the recent rejection by the Hong Kong Air Transport Licensing Authority of its request to operate charters, weekly to Hong Kong from Stansted, even though the CAA had approved the application. Although the company had planned to launch its Stansted-Singapore services on 1st June this now appears unlikely following the rejection Hong Kong. An appeal against the A.T.L.A.decision has been lodged. Meanwhile plans to lease purchase Boeing 747-133, EI-BRR (20014) from G.P.A. continue, the aircraft being in a 470-seat configuration.

Manx Airlines: On 28th April a midday departure from the Isle of Man to Heathrow was introduced, via a ten minute stopover in Liverpool, in addition to the morning and evening services. The new schedule will operate Monday-Friday only.
