LBA MOVEMENTS REVIEW - APRIL 1989

The extreme crosswinds of the 11th caused two accidents on the airfield. Cessna 404 D-ICCF inbound from Southend came to grief landing on runway 14 when it veered off to the left and ended up with no nosewheel on the grass in front of the fire station.

LBA MOVEMENTS REVIEW (Contd.)

It was eventually moved into YLA's hangar where it currently sits and will probably be written off. Shortly after this incident the Capital Shorts 360 G-OLBA was landing on 28 when it failed to stop, over-ran the runway and ended up almost in the airport boundary fence by the entrance to the Aero Club. After a long struggle it was finally dragged clear at about 22.50hrs and it retired hurt to the Northair/Capital hangar. Foreigners continue to roll in from all countries, apart from the above mentioned Cessna 404 there were plenty of other Germans. Cessna T310R D-IEAS visited on the 1st and was followed by the Cessna 177 D-ECHR on the 3rd. After D-ICCF we had Cessna 421C D-ICVW on the 14th and the 22nd when it was joined by Cheyenne D-ICPA. Beech 200 D-IBAH put in an appearance on the 25th and night stopping on the 28th was Navajo D-IKAP. From Scandinavia we had Navajo SE-ILL night stopping on the 2nd, Cessna 421C OY-SUL on the 12th and Citation SE-DEY on the 24th as "Interair 202". Three from Belgium were Conquest 00-LFL on the 4th, Mooney M20J 00-JGB on the 24th and Cessna. 402B 00-SVD on the 25th as "SVS441". A country not often represented in our movements is Italy but this month we had two, I-FFLY Learjet 35 on the 18th and I-GJMA Citation on the 19th. The USA was in evidence with PA-28R N91253 night stopping on the 7th and PA-32R N4303V of the Missionary Aviation Fellowship on the 30th. From more exotic climes (but firmly UK based) were Falcon 20 VR-CDB on the 6th and another of the same breed VR-BKH on the 20th. Sole Swiss visitor was the Citation HB-VHA on the 26th. On the military side we had two Hercules on the 3rd XV195/Ascot4761 and XV211/Ascot4762. VC-10 XR807/Ascot2334 on the 4th and Ascot2310 on the 16th. A rare sight on the 18th was the Sea Horon XR443 as Navy736 night stopping. On the 19th two Hercules were XV211/Ascot4317 and XV185/Ascot4318 joined by VC-10 XR808/Ascot2313. On the 23rd it was another VC-10 XV101/Ascot2335 and on the 27th we had our first Army BN2T when ZG847/Army112 visited. Ending the month on the 28th were Hercules XV185/Ascot4320 and XV215/Ascot4321 with VC-10 XR807/Ascot2308 and Tri-star ZE705/Ascot3362. The Beech Staggerwing G-RDGK arrived at YLA for its annual checks on the 8th and was still present at the end of the month. Another arriving for annual checks was the UN Cessna 4210 G-BHKJ which came in early in the month and returned to Pakistan on the 15th. Temporarily based here from the 17th (and still here at the end of the month) was the Dollar Jetranger G-BTWW which operated most days as "Dollar33". New registration noted was the Learjet G-SOVN which went to Gatwick on the 25th. Two new residents are Navajo G-BNDS which arrived on the 11th and the new Shorts 360 G-OEEC for Capital which arrived as "Capital106" on the 27th in time to start the new route to Brussels. The movement of soil from the south side to fill in the new apron area is now complete and the southern taxiway has been re-opened. Meanwhile Capital are tearing the insides out of the Morthair hangar and lowering the floor to enable their 360's to get in for maintenance. At the moment the front is completely off the hangar and all the aircraft are living outside including the damaged Cessna 414 OY-CGC which has the starboard engine removed. Certification of the Mooney M2OL G-RAAD is nearing completion and it is due for air test on May 9th.

"BUT I HAVE BEEN PROVED WRONG BEFORE"

Those members of two years standing will remember that Chris and I went to Florida in April 1987. Don't ask me how we managed it , but our wives allowed us to go again! The plan was that this time we would concentrate on the Miami/Fort Lauderdale area. Everything was booked and despite the slight mishaps we booked in for Continental Flight 31 from Gatwick to Miami, at 8am on Wednesday 29th March. The planned departure time was 10am and boarding the aircraft at 9.45, we didn't think that we would be too late. However, the Captain announced that they couldn't close the cargo door! We all know what happens when Boeing 747 cargo doors come open, so the inevitable delay. Finally at 4pm, 6 hours late, we took off and an uneventful flight saw us land at dusk in Miami. Just time to pick up the car and go to the hotel. Thursday morning saw us up early and off to Fort Lauderdale Executive. A couple of miles short of the airport, a certain person said that he had forgotten the letter of introduction, so one hour later we eventually started our tour. There were no airliners, mainly biz jets, a Gulfstream 4 N145ST and Challenger N175ST started the shutter moving. There was nothing else of great interest so on to the International Airport.

The first port of call was Chalk's facility where to our surprise was a pair of Dash 7's belonging to Nerv Griffins Paradise Island Airways in preparation for a new service to the Bahamas. There was nothing new at Hill Air with the exception of a Catalina N69RF which had been restored and is to visit Europe in June, for the Paris Air Show. Another bonus was a pair of Martin 404's of System International Airways parked up WFU. The main place of interest was National Jets where a couple of CV440's DC4 and three DC6's were receiving maintenance/loading. At Linton Aviation was a pair of Midwest Airlines Metros which had been bought for refurbishment and resale. Final visit of the day was at Opa Locka where again we had a guided tour of the active side. Some aircraft of two years ago were still there, the Connie and CV240 had gone but another DC6 and a Fairchild C.123 had arrived. Receiving attention was N152LM, ex. YU-AGI a JAT Boeing 707. Parked up engineless were a Kabo Air B.727 5N-AWX and DC-8-21 N821R of Transoceanic Airways.

On to Friday which was spent on the approach to 09L/12 and 09R. Not very easy to take ground shots but not many problems with aerial shots. This visit we had decided we wanted to take some American domestic airlines and various Continental, Pan Am, Delta, U.S.Air, Piedmont, United, Northwest. There were not many Eastern flights as they were involved in a strike!

Saturday was the day of our main travels, up to Belle Glade, across to West Palm Beach and back down to Fort Lauderdale. After a pleasant journey we drove straight past the airfield at Belle Glade. It is not like the usual American airfield but more like a British strip eg Sherburn. To our delight the Environmental Air Services Daks were all parked in the sun plus a bonus of a DC-4 with 'North American Relief Fund' titles. We were only there 20 minutes, but well worth it. Palm Beach was a disappointment with no access where we had previously been allowed, but there was another DC-3 of Missionary Aviation Fellowship which was just photographable.

On the journey back to Fort Lauderdale we stopped off at Lantana, home of Florida Airmotive who have 3 Daks (only 2 present) but also a couple of immaculate Beech 18's. We stopped off at two small airfields at Boca Raton and Pampano Beach but there was nothing of interest to us as it was mainly general aviation with the odd Biz-Jet. We called at Fort Lauderdale International where on our arrival an Inter Canadian aircraft was taxingout. I said it looked like a One Eleven, Chris thought it was a DC-9 actually it was a Fokker 100 C-FICQ. A Federal Express DC-10 N68049 was parked nicely in the sun and we took a few landing shots of American domestics, but the gem was a United Express Brasilia N282UE on delivery and at a small customs and immigration terminal. Just a few polite words from my partner and we were out on the small apron taking a photo as it taxied out.

Sunday, the big day at Miami International, a hot day so the shorts came out! There were only a few South American Carriers, Aeromexica MD80, Avianca 727, Ladeco 727, Taca 767, Mexicana DC-10, TAN 727, Fast Air 707. There were two gems; first a CV580 N12F of Wolfe Enterprises in immaculate condition. This aircraft has never been in airline configuration having been a corporate 'hack' all its life. Secondly, and the title of this little monograph originates from the fact that Chris said "There is a Connie coming in! I am sure its a Connie! But, I have been proved wrong before!" He was correct and the aircraft, which looked in very good condition, was HI-548CT belonging to Aercharyo who fly into Miami three times a week. Enough of the heat, so it was down to New Tiamiami, where to our delight there were four Daks, Two C.46's and an all metal DC-7 HI-524CT of Trado. There was also a couple of Twin Navions, an immaculate Beech 18 and a Bandeirante N107CA of Midnite Express.

Monday was our last visit to Fort Lauderdale to take the DC-3 of Red Aircraft and not to be outdone another immaculately painted DC-3 of Air Adventures (even had a look inside!). A CV240 M1020C an Trans Florida was parked at National Jets, so that was "taken". A couple of hours at the end of the runway saw us get a Delta and United DC-8 - nice - a Minerve DC-8 and a couple of Canadian 737's. Back to the maintenance area for a Gulfstream 1 M50LS and a DC-6 HI558 (operator not known). One extremely rare twin was parked and "snapped". Chris has told me it is a Pacific Airmotive Corp. Tradewind. It looks like a Beech 18 with a single fin. A quick trip down to New Tamiami for Chris to go in the Weeks Air Museum (afraid it was military-not interested).

The remaining two days were spent at Miami trying to get the odd aircraft missed, but also included a tour of the maintenance area, care of US Customs (nice lads). Not to bore you but various DC-3s, DC-6 of Trans Air Link Aerial Transit and FA Connex; DC-8 of Rich, Pegasus, Rich International Agro Air Challenge, Andes (Ecuador), Airlift, B.707 of Caribbean Cargo, Challenge , Florida West; Electra of ALM, TPI; Fairchild FH. 227 of Airlift. On approach to the airport was a Haiti Air Freight DC-4 -nice- and a Tan Mettra plus a C-46 N1651M.

We had seen (and photographed) a wide variety of "heavy metal", more than the previous visit. There is a lot less "scrap" parked up, the airports are trying to clean up their maintenance areas and one disappointment for Chris, not a single

Southern Air Transport Hercules seen.

I am afraid to say that we were delayed yet again on the flight home (only three hours this time), back to wet and dismal Gatwick. Dare we start planning our next trip??
