The menth started in style with Gulfstream III N263C on the 1st and 2nd, joined on the 1st by Cessna 182 00-EIM and on the 2nd by Cessna 421 F-BPPY. Another US Biz-Jet was Citation N15AW on the 3rd. On the 6th we were invaded by the five Fokker S-i1's of the "Schiphol Flyers" registered PH-ACG/GRY/HOC/HOK/HOL who were on a promotional tour, they night stopped and did a demo the following day. Also on the 6th were Navajo SE-IAC which n/s and Citation D-IAEC which didn't. After that things quietened down a bit, Cessna 421C D-ICVW on the 8th was followed by King Air F-GBLU on the 10th and Cessna 425 N425PJ on the 11th. On the 13th Cessna 182 N6243N came in from Gamston for radio work, it did not stay but is due to become PH-HCT when delivered to Holland. On the 17th Aer Lingus sneaked in the BAC 1-11

Two regulars were Rockwell 690 D-IMWT on the 24th and 25th and Aztec EI-BNV on the 25th. Another Rockwell 690 was OY-BEJ on the 27th and finishing off the month on the 31st were King Air EI-BLI, King Air PH-DMJ and Seneca D-GDWR c/n 34-7970448. AIRLINE REVIEW

BRITISH have reserved the registration sequence G-BKYA/N for the leased Boeing 737-200's that are to replace the ageing Tridents from 1986. Boeing 747 G-BDXM has been re-registered G-BDXL and is to be used by Airtours.

BRITISH CALEDONIAN have registered the first two A310's as G-BKWT/U. Aircraft recently offered for sale include 1 x B707, 2 x DC10 and 4 x BAC 1-11, the later 6 aircraft being ex-Laker. They have also announced an order for 7 Airbus A320 to replace their BAC One Elevens.

BRITISH MIDLAND have acquired a 75% stake in Loganair. They hope that this will increase their chances of obtaining a licence to operate Glasgow - New York by means of showing traffic demand by Loganair feeder services to Glasgow. The CAA and British Airports prefer transatlantic traffic to use Prestwick. The airline will continue to operate under the Loganair name. The two ex Tanzania F27's G-EMAU/W were delivered 11/9 and 11/10 respectively.

BAF AIR TOURS Viscount G-AOHV has been leased to Euroair. G-AOYI has been repainted with Guernsey Airlines titles. G-BBDK has been acquired to operate the Guernsey - UK paper contract and for Ad hoc charter work.

DAN AIR are to replace the BAe 146-100's by Series 200's, the 100's going to an unnamed American airline. If the Heathrow - Manchester licence application is successful, it will be operated by BAe.146 and services from Manchester to Scandinavia would be considered. They are to lease two B737 to BMA to use on Heathrow to Scotland routes.

JERSEY EUROPEAN The two F27's on order are ex TAT F-GCMA/R and are to be delivered 1/11 and 1/1/84 respectively.

LOGAMAIR have been given a licence to operate Manchester - Belfast Harbour on a twice daily basis.

MANX are now using a DMC6 (ex Spacegrand??) on Blackpool - IOM services.

TRIP REPORT

Manchester Air Traffic Control Sub-Centre and Tower

Our group arrived punctually at Airport Information at 19.30 on Friday 14th October. We were met by the watch supervisor and escorted into the training/lecture room used by the CAA on the 4th floor of the tower block. After a short introductory talk we were escorted into the control room where the control of all of northern England from Birmingham to Scotland, and across the water as far as Belfast, is controlled up to FL 130. As Friday evening is not especially busy in October the consoles were split East of Amber 1 and Amber 1 to the West, with control being operated on 124-2 and 125-65. Alongside these controllers is the Manchester Approach controller. Despite the heavy workload the controllers found time to assist us and answer and explain many things which were put to them, even producing spare headsets for listening in and connecting the output into speakers for us all to join in with the goings on.

It would be impossible not to be impressed by the computer controlled radar display which gives the position, identity, height, destination of every aircraft flying which is giving a mode G squalk. It was while watching this display that SU345B was seen crossing (TR, FL350 - the first (perhaps) SU flight for about 35 days. The trips into the tower were made in two groups, each of six. (You really do get a good view from up there). Here the final approach, landing, taxiing, start-ups, airways clearances, ground vehicles are all controlled by a team of four. Pack downstairs the radar showed two Air UK flights, one outbound from Leeds and the other inbound. Time passed very quickly and it was time for our visit to end before the watch changed over. A most interesting trip for those who went, (our second visit this year), and I know there will be many who await the opportunity to visit the centre again - it can be arranged as long as the generous attitude of the CAA and its officers stays so helpful and obliging.

FLYOVERS - The Dot Spot

The last Aeroflot flight for a while was seen on September 13th when SU5301 went along Blue 1 towards Shannon and across the water. This flight number is usually used by VIP flights and will hopefully prove to be a different aircraft and thus a gap filler. SU5301 was also seen on the 1st of the month. One to set your watch with at present is the Gubana flight on Tuesday. CU1479 crosses CTR at 17.00 plus or minus 5 minutes. On Tuesday September 6th it crossed OTR at the same time as TF7120, a Tu134 on a charter into MCR, and six minutes later DDR-SCN and CU12?? were both in clear view together, a couple of rarer sights in our skies. Friday 9th September saw a 'new' B747 on the QF service into MCR, VH-EBR made a change from H, I, J, K which hold about 100% of the flights up to now. A surprise on 22nd was TL369 going home towards Beirut at the height of the fighting there. Better sightings this month have included some of the new Swissair 'Big Top' B747, several AZ B747's which are rarer on Amber 1 than the DC10 aircraft, Arista (AD) DC8, Capitol (CL) and Overseas National with a DC8, which could provide interest as OV seem to be operating a variety of aircraft.

The Singapore registered B727, was a welcome sight. I know nothing about the aircraft but I am sure of the call sign. Of the others I could not see Falcon 50 because of haze but the rest were clear and bright in the sky. The Bermudan Gulf 2 is fairly regular along R4 going to its European base at Schipol.

On the airliner front the steady flow of SU IL62's is with us again, there being over ten flights through Shannon in each direction and so on some days at least three aircraft can be seen along Blue 1. Sunday 23rd all eastbound SU342 07.20; SU348B 11.46; SU334 13.15. A Thursday has been known to yield four: SU342 early: SU301 lunchtime; SU333 late afternoon; SU345 around 5 p.m.

Most welcome has been the routing of several American Tran Air flights up Amber 1 although only one has been seen TZ618 on Monday 10th, POL 17.31 DCS.

On the 23rd LY876 was seen along R4 routing towards OTR mid afternoon. This was noteworthy as it was mostly painted red and is presumably 4X-AXZ which had been leased to Avianco.

The I.T. season is slowing down and this often causes some more interesting aircraft from Balkan and Tarom, who substitute Tu134 or IL-18's for the bigger Tu154 used in peak season.

B747SP's are rare but should be more common over the winter with PA operating these into LHR on the PA100 and PA10 flights, and the PA124/125 flights on Monday

The B747-300 BIG TOPS are to be seen on most SR flights now, and KLM also have one although it is used on different flights and it is very hard to check the size of the blue lump against a olue sky at 35,000 feet!
