Once again it was a fairly quiet month at Robin Hood, although there does seem to be a little more activity by Netjets with Marshalls now carrying out maintenance on their Citations. # DAY BY DAY @ LBIA

On the airline front we bid a fond farewell to Aer Arran, who cease operations from LBIA at the end of August. A full run-down of what we can expect this winter follows this section. With Jet2 Boeing 757 G-LSAB is expected to head to Lasham in mid-September to have winglets fitted, which are expected to reduce fuel consumption by 15%.

At Multiflight Citationjet 3 G-OMBI was delivered to Ravenheat on 7/8 and replaces the Citation 2 N550PD, which has returned to the States. Another Citation 2 G-EJEL, which has been a resident for some time, is now officially based at Faro with its owners having moved over to Portugal. Eclipse Jet N117EA arrived on 11/8 and is expected to be a new resident, replacing the Extra 400 N400YY. However, there has been some computer software problems with these aircraft and both this aircraft and N382EA, which arrived last month have not been seen at LBIA for some time so they are presumably away getting updated. Cirrus SR.20 N184CD(See photo below by Martyn Gill) is a new resident having arrived on 13/8 and this aircraft is expected to take up British marking G-JOEW is the near future. Air Malta:- Airbus 319 aircraft will be used to fly Malta – LBIA – Newcastle – Malta on Tuesday evening through the winter however there are gaps in the service especially around Christmas/New Year.

Air Southwest:- The airline is continuing their successful twice each weekday flights f/t Plymouth/Bristol, although there was talk of adding a further direct flight f/t Plymouth at lunchtimes this would seem not to have materialized. There will be one flight each Sat/Sun plus a direct Newguay flight on Saturdays.

Austrian Arrows:- Fokker 70 aircraft operate Sat f/t Innsbruck from 20/12 until 25/4.

bmi regional:- The main change here is that the Heathrow flight is due to be down graded from Airbus 319 to Embraer 145 operations from the end of October. Other flights to Brussels/
Copenhagen/Glasgow/Edinburgh are expected to continue as normal, although some less frequency on the Scottish flights can be anticipated. A combination of 3 EMB.135/145 should still be based at LBIA.

#### AIRPORT NEWS

Coventry Airport has lost its High Court appeal over plans to build a new terminal building capable of handling up to two million passengers a year. A judge upheld the Government's decision to reject moves to build a new terminal and dealt a potentially fatal blow to expansion plans for the airport. Airport bosses had gone to the High Court following last year's shock decision by the Government's chief planning inspector to block the terminal bid. West Midlands International Airport Ltd had asked Mr Justice Forbes, sitting in London, to overturn a decision taken last April by Hazel Blears, Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government, blocking the project. The judge ruled that the minister's decision was not legally flawed and refused to intervene.

London mayor Boris Johnson is proposing to close down Heathrow and replace it with a 24-hour airport in the Thames estuary, the Times reports. The new London airport, most likely to be located on an artificial island off Sheppey in Kent, would have four runways, but capacity for two more if required. Mr Johnson believes the new airport would solve congestion at Heathrow, which serves 67m passengers a year, and create new jobs east of the capital. The plans would see passengers transported to and from central London on high-speed trains in about 35 minutes. Luggage could be checked in at the railway station. The airport also would be connected to the Channel tunnel rail link, opening up fast passenger and freight routes to northern Europe. Brussels, for example, would be about 90 minutes away by train. Mr Johnson's aides believe the scheme, loosely modelled on Hong Kong international airport, could take just six years to build,

eventually leading to a phased closure of Heathrow and possibly even Gatwick, the newspaper reports. They say that the Heathrow site, which employs 70,000 workers, could ultimately be turned into Britain's equivalent of Silicon Valley, with technology parks and affordable homes.

London City Airport has received planning permission to increase its take-offs and landings by around 50 percent. Despite residents' fears of increased noise, the number of flights will increase from 80,000 to 120,000. The airport, which mainly operates business flights for the financial services industry in the City of London and Canary Wharf, has grown rapidly in recent years with passenger volumes rising by more than 20 percent a year in both 2006 and 2007. It was bumping up against its existing limit of 80,000 movements a year, but on Wednesday night the local planning authority, the London Borough of Newham, approved a 50 percent increase to 120,000 movements annually. Although growth in both commercial passenger numbers and corporate jet movements has been hit hard by the turmoil in global financial markets, passenger traffic is still forecast to rise from 2.9m to 3.2m this year. Passengers are expected to be flat until 2010 but as growth in demand resumes the airport expects the higher limit on flight numbers to allow passenger numbers to rise to more than 3.9m with the number of jobs at the airport increasing by 1,000 to more than 3.000. The airport has already invested heavily to create facilities to cope with higher numbers and in recent months has added four more aircraft stands. It has opened a new pier and has almost doubled the size of the departure lounge. It has a growing network of European and domestic short-haul destinations, as business travellers take the opportunity to avoid the congestion at the main London airports. There are no plans to change the airport's operating hours, so it will continue to close at night and for 24 hours at the weekend. Newham council also rejected the airport's application to increase early morning movements.

# **AIRLINE NEWS**

Astraeus- has switched from scheduled and charter services to a 100% aircraft provision and leasing business. The majority of its fleet of Boeing 737 and 757 aircraft have been almost completely committed through to the end of 2010. Chief executive Mario Fulgoni said: 'While the majority of the fleet is contracted out, we are ensuring we maintain a degree of flexibility by retaining ad-hoc aircraft – which meant we were able to assist in rescuing travellers in the wake of the XL collapse, for instance. This also enables us to provide short-notice cover if operators have an urgent requirement.' 'We have re-defined Astraeus as being focused on airline operations and development support. While we are currently providing dry, damp or wet-lease aircraft to a number of established carriers, we are also in negotiation with a number of potential start-ups.'

Flyglobespan- has signed deals to lease up to four of its aircraft to Chilean Airways over the winter, the Times reports. Two of the airline's 737-300s will fly for Chilean Airways until next summer. A further two will join the Chilean fleet for two months early next year. The deal is the latest move by the airline to utilise its aircraft over the slower winter months as the industry faces increasing pressure from soaring fuel costs and the economic slowdown. A two-year leasing contract with the Ministry of Defence flying twice-weekly from the UK to the Falkland Islands began last week. Flyglobespan also has another 737-300 on charter in Egypt, a bigger 757 flying from Birmingham to India and other leasing deals in the South Pacific and Oman.

Jet2.com- has announced new routes from Belfast, Newcastle and Manchester Airport. Next Summer the airline will operate flights between the Greek island of Rhodes and Manchester, with fares from £68.99 one way including taxes. The announcement comes weeks after the airline announced plans to fly to Olbia in Sardinia from Manchester next summer. The new service will start from May 20. Jet2 is also launching flights between Newcastle and Cork. The route is now on sale now with fares from £24.99. Passengers will be able to fly directly from Belfast International Airport to Croatia and Cornwall from May next year, it was announced today. However, as airline Jet2 unveiled its new routes to Dubrovnik and Newquay, it axed its flights to Barcelona with effect from October 26. Jet2 said the additional routes, which are expected to create 50 new jobs, proved it was bucking the downturn in the airline and travel sector. Chief executive Philip Meeson said: 'These are exciting times for us and, unlike other airlines who are grounding planes, we are expanding our range of destinations and are planning to increase our overall capacity from Northern Ireland.' From Edinburgh new routes are Ibiza, Menorca and Venice from Edinburgh Airport next summer, Jet2 will also fly to

Düsseldorf from Edinburgh during the summer 2009. The route will take off on March 29 and with fares starting from just £24,99 one way including taxes.

Kiss Flights- has established a website (kissflights.com) to start selling tickets to 11 destinations next summer, replacing some of the capacity lost when XL Airways went bust last month. Described as a 'dynamic travel company', the firm has been set up by Gatwick-based aviation broking firm Meridian Aviation. The website says Kiss Flights is a trading name of Meridian Aviation and the companies share the same address. Kiss, which is advertising ATOL bonding protection on its website, plans to fly from Gatwick and Manchester to seven Greek islands, Dalaman in Turkey, the Egyptian Red Seas resorts of Sham el Sheikh and Hurghada and the Canary Islands. All were key holiday destinations served by XL Airways.

LTE- announced its suspension of flights on its website after telling Spanish authorities that it was in serious financial difficulty. LTE's website stopped taking bookings late on Thursday 13th October, after it said it, could not cover costs for the next few days.

Ryanair- chief executive, Michael O'Leary, said his plans to invest in a start-up transatlantic long-haul airline could be progressed if there were a sharp fall in aircraft prices due to the crisis in the global aviation industry. Any long-haul business would be run separately from Ryanair. He said: 'The business plan is done . . . but it has been parked until there is a big downturn in the industry and Boeing and Airbus are parking long-haul aircraft, so we can get a deal on prices.' Mr O'Leary said he would bring in other investors and that he had discussed the plan with shareholders including David Bonderman, Ryanair chairman and co-founder of TPG, the US private equity group, and with former executives of Southwest Airlines and Continental Airlines of the US. The venture would aim to operate from up to 10 existing Ryanair bases in Europe to a similar number of destinations in the US. The airline would offer economy and business class services, as without the high fare revenues from premium services rivals such as British Airways, Lufthansa and Air France-KLM.

Thomsonfly- has said it is halting its operations from Coventry Airport from the beginning of November. The decision means that Coventry will be left without any passenger airline service, although its business aviation and cargo operations will continue. The news comes a week after the airport lost a High Court appeal to build a passenger terminal capable of handling two million passengers a year. Thomsonfly runs the only passenger service at the midlands hub, where it began operations in March 2004 when it also operated the airport in an agreement with its local council owner. The airline said the decision reflected its increased focus on charter flights, rather than the scheduled ones operating from Coventry. The final Thomsonfly flights take off from Coventry on November 2, with inbound flights axed after November 9. Passengers booked to fly out of Coventry with Thomsonfly after 2 November will receive a refund or alternative flight, Thomsonfly said. Those affected should contact the airline's customer service department. A spokesman said it would try to find its staff at the airport other jobs in the company.

XL Airlines- failure as part of XL Leisure Group has left around 285,000 travellers hit after the country's third largest package holiday group went into administration with 85,000 stranded abroad. The XL Leisure Group, which operates XL airlines and sells packaged holidays under a number of brand names, flies to 50 destinations, mainly in the Mediterranean, from a dozen UK airports, became the biggest holiday operator failure for more than two decades today. All of its flights were cancelled, and its aircraft grounded and its customers advised not to go to the airport. The Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) said 85,000 people were stranded abroad and 200,000 have made advance bookings with the company. Mr Clover said package deals are covered by the CAA's Air Travel Organisers' Licensing (ATOL) scheme and those customers were offered repatriation flights or their money back if they have an advance booking. However, those who booked directly with the airline or XL.com will face a fee. [It is estimated that more than 10,000 people were not ATOL protected because they booked separate flights and accommodation or flights only.

#### AIRCRAFT NEWS

Boeing delivered 84 planes in the third quarter, 23 percent fewer aircraft than the same period in 2007 ... when the company was not enduring a machinists strike and its country was not experiencing serious financial concern. Boeing has not produced aircraft since Sept. 6, when 27,000 machinists walked off the job seeking a stronger health, pension and compensation plan. The company has seen record demand as airlines seek modern and more fuel-efficient aircraft and its deliveries equate to profits. At this time, Boeing has an order backlog for nearly 3,700 aircraft, which would keep the

machinists busy for another seven years if they slightly improved on their recent 40 aircraft per month output. Running with substantial cash reserves and not overburdened by debt, Boeing's current condition is not yet compounded by any credit crisis, real or perceived, but its customers (and perhaps its employees) may not feel they enjoy the same luxuries. Boeing can help insulate certain buyers through its own financing, but the fragility of the airline industry compounded by a global economic slowdown could lead to order cancellations. According to Boeing, that hasn't happened, yet, but the company acknowledges the importance of maintaining low costs and high operating efficiency amid worldwide economic uncertainty and internal unrest.

RAF IN LINCOLN SHIRE, PART 3, by David Senior

# Above, 3 Squdron Typhoon

RAF Coningbsy has become known as fighter town in the last few decades. The last three RAF fighter aircraft that have come into service have started there service lives at this base .First came the mighty Phantom followed by the Tornado F.3 and now the next generation fighter aircraft the Typhoon or tea bag as it is known among the spotters.

As all my directions the RAF airfield have been via the A1 I will continue to do so, but I have never gone direct to the airfield always choosing to go to all the airfields in the Lincolnshire area so I will leave it to you to plan a visit accordingly. So from Yorkshire continue to go down the A1 until Newark where you leave the A1 and go onto the A17 where you can call into the excellent Newark Air Museum at Winthorpe, continue on the A17 passing past RAF Cranwell(which I have covered already). Just north of Sleaford you turn left onto the A153 and heading north east along this road you will enter the village of Coningsby from the south. Half way into the village you will see a sign for the airfield, turn right onto this road and continue along it until the mini roundabout. Here you have a choice you can take the first left which will take you past the main gate until you come to a crash gate. Do not park in front of the crash gate as this upsets the RAF police there is plenty of parking nearby and you will most likely see many spotters in this spot as it is a good place to photo passing aircraft going to the take-off on the north east runway. If you continue on at the mini roundabout you will come to the main hangers at the airfield the nearest of which is the Battle of Britain hanger where all the BoB Memorial Flight aircraft are housed. A very interesting few hours can be spent in the hanger which is open to the public most weekdays all through the year. Just after the hanger there is a small parking area for about ten cars which will give you a good view of aircraft parked on the ramp. If you are unable to get all of the serials of the aircraft walk along the fence and you should obtain the rest of the aircraft. Do not forget to walk the other way towards the BoB hanger as you will be able to see into the hanger directly in front of you which house the Typhoon's of 17/29 Squadron and even if you can't get the serial number you can usually get the codes off the aircraft in the hanger. If you continue along the road after about 200 yards you will see a large parking area on the right where you can see most of the airfield. When parked you will see that there is a large number of hardened shelters to your right that goes down parallel with the main runway nearly out of sight. This is where the Typhoon Fighter Squadrons are housed, in the nearest shelters are the 3 squadron aircraft and at the bottom area are those of 11 squadron. If the aircraft are landing over the car park which is not the usual way then continue up the road until you are at the other side of the runway. Where the airfields wooden fence stops there is a track which you can drive down parking by a large earth mound on top of which you can get some good shots of aircraft taxing from the hardened shelters waiting to take off and also landing aircraft but you do need a good telephoto lens. You can however walk back up the track to the road where you can also get great shots of landing aircraft from the road (watch out for traffic as the locals don't always bother to stop at the traffic lights that operate when aircraft are landing). If you continue on this minor road it will take a 90 degree left turn. Continue on the road till you enter the small village of Hawthorpe Hill where you take a left turn and next right, this leads you onto a one track road behind all the hardened shelter area . You can pick up the odd aircraft hidden in this area. The road continues until a T junction where you can take another left which will take you right up to the 11 squadron shelter area crash gate, there you can see the 11 sqn mascot which is a superb looking Lighting in 11 sqn colours XR753 code X1. Reverse back down the road you have come up and when you arrive at the T junction continue on the road into Scrub Hill village where you can either turn right back to Coningsby or if aircraft are landing from the north east take a left to New York village there you will take a left onto the B1132 after a short distance you will come to the traffic lights at the end of the runway where there is a little parking area for about six cars. The aircraft can be seen on approach a long way off and when the lights stop the traffic you can cross the road and take brilliant landing shots especially during the afternoon when the sun is in a good position.

# 17 Squadron

All tactics, armaments, software, air-to-air re-fuelling, general handling of the aircraft and operational manuals are carried out-written by this squadron before it is approved for operations with the front line squadrons. The squadron will eventually merge with 41 squadron but not for some time. The squadron codes are in the AA-AZ range and are carried in white on top of the tail with the squadron badge underneath. The squadron bars are two black wavy lines on a white background just aft of the cockpit.

## 29 Squadron

The second Typhoon squadron formed is the TOCU (Typhoon Operational Conversion Unit). This unit trains all pilots coming from Flying Training School or Converting from other aircraft to flying the Typhoon up to Squadron standard. Like all the rest of the squadrons the Code is on top of the tail in the BA-BZ series with the squadron badge underneath. # 41 Squadron

The only squadron bases at Coningsby that is not equipped with the typhoon. This unit is the Fast Jet and Weapons Operational Evaluation Unit. It operates the same way as 17 squadron but with the rest of the fast jets operated by the RAF. This year it lost its Jaguar and now the Tornado F.3 and now operates Tornado GR.4/4a and Harrier GR.9/9a. Any new missile, bomb, defensive suit or software are tested by this unit before it is passed on to front line squadrons, because of this the squadron is often deployed away from its base.

The Typhoon trench 1(batch) serials are ZJ800-815 as T.1's and ZJ910-943 as F.2's air to air mode only all of these will be or have been upgrade to R2 standard which will make them T.3 or FGR.4. This mean that the aircraft are able to be in air to air mode or ground attack mode. Those that have been upgraded to R2 standard or are being upgraded at BAES Warton are marked \* The squadron allocations are very fluid at the moment because of the aircraft upgrade and aircraft are operating with other squadrons but I have listed the aircraft with the markings that are being carried at the time of this article. This week the first two trench 2 aircraft have been released to the RAF by BAES and where delivered to Coningsby on 21st October but no squadron allocations have come to light as I write.
