The foreigners continue to creep in slowly. First of the month was the Citation OY-CYT on the 3rd which used the callsign "Air Alsie 361" and night stopped. The King Air A100 F-GFVM on the 5th used the callsign "Sin Air 011" and visiting on the same day was the Rockwell 690B 00-WAT. Having had our first ever Portuguese registration last year we rapidly had another when the Air Atlantis Boeing 737 CS-TII visited as "Atlantis 581-2" on the 6th. UK based King Air 90 VR-CCT made the first of three visits this month on the 9th, the other two visits were on the 14th and 31st. The Challenge Air King Air F-GETJ made its first visit of the year on the 10th as "CIG 221". A new Citation to the LBA was OY-JEY on the 11th which is registered to Lars Christiansen but was booked in to Brantford International. Night stopping on the 16th was Twin Comanche N8484Y which is a 1967 model with c/n 30-1647. A slightly newer Piper was the Seneca 00-VTA on the 17th which is c/n 34-8133049 making it a 1981 model. Another King Air was F-GILE which is a 200 and used the callsign "ARL 101" on the 18th and belongs to Soc. Airlec. Doing a proving flight prior to the Summer season was the Airbus 320 of Euro Cypria 5B-DBB on the 19th using callsign "Cypriana 321T". The same day found King Air 90 0Y-CCC night stopping, according to my register this belongs to the unlikely sounding PPHSC 33 Aps ? Doing a hospital flight from Iraklion on the 22nd was the Executive Jet Aviation Lear Jet 36A HB-VFS with the callsign "EJE 175". Cessna 210 EI-BUF owned by the 210 Club visited on the 25th along with the King Air 350 VR-CSH and King Air 200 F-GFTA which used callsign "FRI 751-2". The 26th found us with three foreigners night stopping, Tulip Air's two Navajo's were PH-GYN "Tulip 01A-B" and Jetair's Falcon 10 was F-GBTI. Diverting in with technical trouble on the 28th was Warrior N4306Z which is one of the USAF Aero Club's aircraft and was en route from Upper Heyford to Leuchars which is a fairly long haul. Another flag of convenience registration was the Gulf stream 840 VR-BLK on the 30th which belongs to Control Techniques Plc. What must be the best foreigner for some time was the Challenger 9Q-CBS of Scibe of Zaire which visited on the 31st from and to Brussels and was our first aircraft registered in Zaire. Also on the 31st was the Cessna 340A D-INCI. A few of the UK registered visitors also stand out. On the 2nd Air UK borrowed the Gill Air Short 360 C-SBAC and it arrived as "UK 032", it is ex EI-BEL. Air UK also brought in a couple of smaller aircraft with spares for their engineers, Navajo G-WROX was "UK 053" on the 13th and Cessna 4210 G-MARR was "UK 053" on the 26th. Their Short 360 G-BLZT was noted on the "UK706" on the 27th, it went missing on the 28th but on the 29th it arrived back as "Jersey 033" in Jersey Europeans colours and went into service for them. On the 28th Dan-air's new Boeing 737 400 G-BSNW operated through the LEM for the first time. For me the star of the month (which I did not see because I was at work) was the newly restored Dove 8 G-OPIC of RSJ Aviation which arrived as "RSJ 01" on the 25th. Two departures this month. Cessna 421C G-FWRP has gone to a new owner down South. The Cessna 340 G-OCAN did an air test on the morning of the 27th and was then painted as VR-CHR and departed for Guernsey at 1922hrs. The latest Yorkshire Aeroplane Club aircraft to be painted in the new blue and white colours is G-BFGL whilst G-OJVH is away at Cranfield being done at the moment. Nearly forgot the military!! The Wessex XR504 on the 10th is one of 22 Squadrons and was "Rescue 125". Sea King ZA310 spent three days in the area starting on the 13th and it night stopped at Coney Park, it was using callsign "Navy ZV". An unusual VP visitor on the 20th was the Hawk XX159 from Hatfield as "BHW 06"; on the same day Hercules XV219 was "Ascot 5643". Full emergency standby was laid on for the Jet Provost XW293 "FYY 15" on the 23rd when it had to divert in with a blown canopy. It crept off to YIA to lick its wounds and departed back to Finningley on the 26th. Coming in for a check with the CAA examiner on the 24th was Jetstream XX491 "FYY 60". A Royal Flight for Her Majesty the Queen on the 27th was made by BAe 146 ZE702 as "Kitty 1". Final military of the month was Andover XS794 "Ascot 1464".

Coney Park is now a fully licenced Airfield so we have lost all their Helicopters from the movements.

D-CRMW has been heard on several occasions coming out of/going into EMA. The aircraft is of course owned by BMW who are tipped as being interested in the financially troubled Rolls Royce car company who have their headquarters at Derby. I'm only guessing.... but time will tell!

Jos Air use MAN as a fuel stop when head winds over the north Atlantic are too strong for their flights to get Sofia/JFK direct.

SAS flights often route over OTR and turn left to LHR approaching the MCT but it was nice to see some of the regular Stansted flights come this way on the 20th. The normal route is down the North Sea to Clacton.

Acroflot have also been noted taking different routes **recently.** Normal flights take them straight along the URI route and then left turn at OTR to DANDI. I've always assumed that the station at Fylingdales was one reason for the lack of shortened routings as well as the Military flying areas. However with recent political changes several flights have been seen to cut the corner taking them almost WAL direct DANDI so that they end up north of Leeds.

I will list next month all the known flight numbers usually used by companies for delivery, training or other non regular operations.

AZA620 now operated by MD11. AAL will start using these on the AAL54/55 from April 6th at MAN. Are thought to be on several services into Europe already, AAL84/85 for one. SWR use MD11s on flights 106/108/120/138. AFR using B767 on AFR015/027/035/075 and B747 400 noted on AFR077.

Over the weekend of 6th to 8th March the usual bi-annual invasion of French rugby union supporters came to Edinburgh. Over the Saturday and Sunday there was little opportunity to see aircraft because of weather but Friday was clear with 'trailing' skies. ## A JOURNEY TO THE EAST

My interest in aviation stems back some twenty-five years to the days when as a young boy I spent many hours at Manchester Airport plane spotting. Then most of the traffic was turbo or piston engined such as Viscounts, Vanguards, Ambassadors, Constellations and DC-3s. Nowadays my interest in aviation is from a career point of view and I am fortunate that my job as a travel agent allows me various trips around the world at favourable rates. On the morning of Wednesday 8th May I made an early start to drive down the M1 and round the M25 to Heathrow Airport. After parking the car I checked in with Singapore Airlines within terminal 3 for flight SQ19 to Singapore via Bombay due to depart at 0930 hours. As a bonus for arriving early all passengers checking in more than two hours before departure are given a £5 breakfast voucher so I was able to enjoy a hearty breakfast before boarding the aircraft. I had managed to book seats by the window on row 41 which are by the emergency exit over the wing and enjoy lots of leg room. At about 0940 hours Boeing 747-400 Megatop 9V-SME taxied out from stand and took off on a bright sunny London morning. We soon entered cloud which was with us all the way so not much to see I'm afraid. It was therefore time to settle back, enjoy a good meal, fine wine and the superb Singapore Tiger beer before watching the film as we sped high above the Med. and Middle East. By the time we arrived at Bombay some eight hours fifty minutes later it was dark as local time was 22.50 hours. The airport has no transit lounge so we were forced to stay on board as the aircraft was cleaned and prepared for the onward flight. The airport was very quiet but quite a few Air India Jumbos plus Indian Airlines Boeing 737's and Airbuses were noted.

## A JOURNEY TO THE EAST

After about 40 minutes the aircraft filled almost to capacity with new passengers and we took off for the five hour forty minute flight to Singapore, Our arrival at Changi Airport was at 0930 hours local time bang on schedule. We docked nose in at Terminal 2 beside an SIA Airbus and a Malaysian B.737. Changi Airport has been voted the world's best for the last three years, an award it certainly deserves. Terminal 2 runs parallel with one of the main runways, all aircraft docking nose in. It can accommodate 30 Jumbo's side by side so you can tell the length of the building. Inside one has to just stand back and admire the cleanliness of the thick pile carpets and polished marble. Plenty of seats, shops, restaurants and even waterfalls, fishponds and aquariums make it a most pleasant place. Baggage claim and customs formalities were soon over and we were on our way to our hotel for a shower and brush up. After two days of extensive sightseeing in this lovely city it was back to Changi for the Tradewinds flight to Kuantan, in Malaysia. Tradewinds is a subsidiary of S.I.A. and flys two Boeing 737-3YOs on mainly local services to Asian exotic resort areas. 9V-TRA was waiting for us at Gate F85 and we departed at 1310 hours for the forty minute flight Various SIA aircraft were noted plus Garuda F.28 & DC-9, Malaysian 737, Air China 767 and a UTA 747. I knew Kuantan to be a very quiet airport with approx. 8 scheduled flights a day mainly to Kuala Lumpur. What I didn't know was that it is also a very important military airfield. After landing we made a left turn and taxied in front of a row of twelve R.M.A.F. Skyhawks, 6 Pilatus PC-7, 4 Bulldogs and a S-61N before crossing the main runway to park by the small terminal building on an apron capable of holding just one aircraft. We returned to Kuantan some nine days later to a chaotic terminal building, checked in with Malaysian Airlines and waited in the very stuffy building for our aircraft to arrive. Across the runway I could see a similar line of military aircraft to when we arrived with the addition of two Hercules. At 1810 hours Malaysian Boeing 737-400 9H-MJM arrived and we were soon on board and on our way back to Singapore. As it was dark when we arrived very few aircraft were seen except for a new Swissair MD-11 which we parked next to. All too quickly the last three days passed away and I was back at Changi checking in with S.I.A. for the return flight. Just before boarding, the television in the lounge at the departure gate flashed up the news of the tragic assasination of Rajiv Candhi. This caused a near stampede as three quarters of the boarding passengers were Indians bound for Bombay. This event was to later alter our return plans considerably. The aircraft provided for our return flight this time was S.I.A.s latest Megatop 9V-SMI just two months old having been delivered on 25th February. The aircraft departed 45 minutes late as two passengers decided not to board at the last minute and all the luggage had to be off-loaded in order to locate theirs. Then, of course, it all had to be reloaded. On departure the usual mixture of Caruda, Malaysian and SIA aircraft were noted plus 747s of Cargolux and Lufthansa. Six hours later we arrived at Bombay after a film and a very good Brunch, A total of 270 people left the aircraft here and we were to pick up a similar number plus change the whole crew before departing for London. As it was daytime one could see an interesting assortment of aircraft around the airfield. A number of retired Boeing 707s plus four DC-3s outside the Airworks India hangar two of which were airworthy plus a couple of Caravelles painted blue and yellow. On the terminal ramp were Air Yemini Boeing 707, (70-ACS) Vayudoot Dornier 228 (VT-EIP), Sabena DC-10 plus a number of Indian Airlines Boeing 737s and Airbuses and Air India Jumbos. It was obvious that there was a strong military presence around the airfield and the aircraft departure time passed without any sign of the change crew or the passengers. Eventually after about two hours the Captain asked the crew to prepare the cabin for departure saying that he would explain all as soon as we were airborne. Mike India was soon started and taxied out for departure. Shortly after take-off the Captain came over the tannoy and made an announcement. Due to the tense atmosphere in Bombay it had been unsafe for the relief crew to leave the hotel. Gangs had taken to the streets, there had been some stone throwing and vehicles set on fire, and many passengers had been unable to get to the airport to check in on time. Inside the airport the tension had boiled over and a number of incidents had been reported.

## A JOURNEY TO THE EAST (Contd.)

Air India and Indian Airlines had cancelled all flights and the airport was in danger of closing altogether. The Captain therefore took the decision to take off in order that the passengers bound for London were not stranded. Fortunately an off duty Captain was on board which meant that the two man aircrewwould be able to extend their duty hours from  $12\frac{1}{4}$  to  $16\frac{1}{2}$  hours ; however , this was still not enough to get us to london. SIA had a spare crew in Athens and therefore we were to make an extra stop there to relieve the cockpit crew and then continue to London. The flight from Bombay being in clear daylight skies was most interesting. After take-off we passed over the city and climbed to our cruising altitude of 35000 feet and headed across the Arabian Sea for Saudi Arabia. The journey over Saudi took nearly three hours and all one could see was sand, sand, sand and more sand, plus the odd oil well and a USAF Galxy flying below us. We then headed over Israel, Cyprus and the Turkish Coast before commencing our descent over some very interestingly shaped Greek Islands into Athens. After touchdown, on the left I could see the Olympic terminal with most of the fleet seemingly parked in front of it. I noted everything from a Dornier 228 to a 747. In order to spend as little time as possible on the ground we again stayed aboard the aircraft but was able to gain good views of the general terminal ramp which contains the same Airbus, Lufthansa 737, two Tower Air 747s, Iberia DC-9, TWA 727, and just to prove I was getting nearer home, an Air 2000 757. On the outskirts of the 'field were a number of derelict DC-3, 727 and 707s.

The cockpit crew were soon changed, aircraft refuelled and we were or our way again for London. The good weather continued and with the aircraft almost emrty, the now tired cabin crew took time off to enjoy the superb clear views of the snow-capped Alps. All too quickly the last couple of hours passed and we were on the ground at Heathrow, remarkably only  $2\frac{1}{2}$  hours late despite the detour. We had been on the go for nearly 24 hours yet the flight attendants looked as fresh as daisies and just as cheerful as the minute we boarded the aircraft; unlike myself who was feeling rather tired and not looking forward to the drive up the M1.

It had been a most enjoyable holiday. The Far East offers an interesting array of sights, excellent food, superb beaches, very cheap shopping and for the aviation enthusiast, plenty of interesting aircreft, and just to put the icing on the cake the beer is excellent as well.

<u>Euroworld Airways</u> have changed their name to City-flier Express on February 3rd. New routes for the summer include flying to Jersey and Guernsey from Leeds and Cardiff.

Three of their Shorts 360 aircraft were seen on 7th March at Gatwick all sporting the new titles and livery.

Tarom are due to begin Transatlantic (via Amsterdam) services with its A.310 aircraft on March 29th so keep your radios tuned to Airways.

Transavia Airlines has returned B.737 PH-TSI to Pluna as CX-BON after lease.

## THE R.A.F. AT ITS POST-WAR PEAK: 1952

With the recently announced changes and reductions in the present strength of the R.A.F. still fresh in the memory, it is appropriate to recall that, 40 years ago, on the 1 July 1952, the Service reached its post-war peak with 6,238 aircraft on charge. The following Commands were operational at that date:

BOMBER COMMAND: this was composed of twenty-six squadrons, including eight operating the Lincoln together with an Operational Conversion Unit, four Canberra squadrons and an O.C.U., eight Washington squadrons, two Mosquito squadrons, two Mosquito PR squadrons, one mixed Lincoln/Mosquito squadron and one Lancaster PR squadron stationed at Nairobi in Kenya.

FIGHTER COMMAND: the majority of the forty-five squadrons in the Command were equipped with the Meteor F.8 (25), together with thirteen Vampire F.3/FB.5 squadrons (all but one being Auxiliary). There were seven squadrons of night-figh(ers equipped with the Meteor NF.11 (4) and Vampire NF.10 (3). Also included were four O.C.U.s and the Central Figh(er Establishment. COASTAL, COMMAND: this comprised six Shackleton squadrons and an O.C.U., two Lancaster MR.3 squadrons, two Sunderland squadrons and an O.C.U., one Neptune squadron (No. 217) which was just starting out on its RAF career and one Hastings Met. Squadron (No. 202). Other units in Coastal Command included the School of Maritime Reconnaissance and the Air-Sea Warfare Development Unit.

TRANSPORT COMMAND: five squadrons of Hastings formed the backbone of the Command. They also served with No.1 Parachute Training School and the O.C.U. There was also one Valetta squadron (No.30) and one communications squadron (No.31), making seven squadrons in all.

HOME COMMAND: this Command included no fewer than twenty-two Reserve Flying Schools, twenty Auxiliary Air Observation Post Flights, five Basic Flying Training Schools, two Basic Air Navigation Schools and five Civil Anti-Aircraft Cooperation Units.

FLYING TRAINING COMMAND: this included eight Advanced Flying Schools, seven Flying Training Schools, five Air Navigation Schools, three Advanced Flying Training Schools and five miscellaneous units including the C.F.S.

MAINTENANCE COMMAND: nineteen Maintenance Units (aircraft storage) supported all the above units.

NO.90 GROUP: this was the Signals Group, with the Central Signals Establishment and No.192 Squadron.

Overseas units included the 2nd Tactical Air Force (Germany), the Middle East

Air Force and the Far East Air Force. In Yorkshire, the following airfields were operational :-
