A Swift Trip....

Early on Monday 24 April saw three spotters; Tony, JB and me, from the TGAE (Tyneside Group of Aviation Enthusiasts) boarding a train in Newcastle Central Station for a trip into deepest Yorkshire. The pre-planning had been hastily completed, but there was still a missing link in the travel plans. On the journey, we "spotted" from the train and saw two Gloster Javelins circling near Darlington, a Varsity T.1 coded "D" of 1 ANS (Air Navigation School) making an approach to its home base of RAF Topcliffe, five Varsitys on the ground as we passed Topcliffe, a Hastings, two Vampire T.11s and a Jet Provost T.3.

We alighted in York and boarded a bus for a place called Tadcaster, which was in the general direction of where we were bound. The bus terminated in Taddie and we were forced to seek a native for advice on onward directions. With the language difficulties overcome, we learned that further progress would have to be on foot – this was the missing link. So with that intrepid British spirit, we set off to walk along the A.162 towards our target, which was RAF Church Fenton.

At the time RAF Church Fenton was the home of 60 MU (Maintenance Unit). This unit had been tasked with scrapping many of the RAF's fleet of Supermarine Swift FR.5 and it was these we were planning to see that day. Tony had written ahead and received permission for a base visit hosted by 60 MU, which was an opportunity not to be missed. We had heard that the Swifts were already there and the scrapping was a full swing, so there was no time to lose before they were stripped bare and disappeared.

The Supermarine Swift was originally intended as a fighter aircraft, but proved to be an outstanding failure in that role, despite Supermarine's fruitless attempts with the Marks 1 to 4. It was subsequently redesigned as a fighter reconnaissance (FR) aircraft, the FR. Mark 5, and served successfully from 1956 to 1961, with two squadrons in the RAF's 2nd TAF (Tactical Air Force) in Germany. It was therefore unusual to see one in the UK and was consequently an attraction. The squadrons in Germany were; 2 Squadron, based at RAF Gutersloh and 79 Squadron, based at RAF Jever. On the accompanying photographs, 2 Squadron aircraft have the squadron marking as white triangles on a black rectangle and the 79 Squadron aircraft have red arrows on a white rectangle. Each aircraft has an individual code letter on the tip of the fin. This was standard RAF practice at the time.

It was a warm day for walking, but undaunted we pressed on with the scent of the Swifts in our nostrils. Not being familiar with deepest Yorkshire, we had little idea how far Church Fenton was from Taddie. It turned out to be much further than we anticipated, some 6 to 7 miles in total. After walking for over an hour, we had turned left onto the B.1223 heading for Ulleskelf, with another hour or so of walking ahead of us. At this point, a hitch-hike seemed a good idea with our appointment time now approaching. Within minutes we had success, when an RAF officer pulled over and offered us a lift. How lucky was that!

Our "chauffeur" dropped us at the Guard Room where Spitfire LF.16 TE288 was assisting with guard duties. We quickly linked up with our guide for the visit, a P.O. Dale, who gave us a very friendly welcome and explained the planned tour. As we toured the 60 MU hangars there was an April shower, but under cover it was not a problem. We then went out onto the apron to study and photograph the Swifts. It was, Wow! I was carrying my new (to me) Kodak Retinette loaded with Ilford FP.3 35 mm film and I was anxious to give the camera its baptism and what a baptism.

The Swifts were lined-up in a rough approximation of a squadron on the front line. Some were already partly stripped of the items to re-cycle and looking sad. They all still wore the camouflage and markings current when they were decommissioned and left Germany. So it was easy to distinguish which of the two squadrons they had served with. Photography was allowed, as you will see from the accompanying photos. At the time I could only afford b&w film and I also did my own developing and enlarging to keep photo costs within my tight budget limits.

I have a full list of the Swifts being processed by 60 MU on that day. A representative selection is as follows: XD962 Swift FR.5 coded "L" of 2 Squadron with the Squadron Commander's name, Squadron Leader C. C. MacDonald, below the cockpit; WK302 Swift FR.5 coded "C" of 2 Squadron; WK276 Swift FR.5 coded "U" of 79 Squadron; WK296 Swift FR.5 coded "J" of 79 Squadron. Also being treated were; WH301 Meteor F.8; XE887 Vampire T.11 from the RAF College at Cranwell; WH303 Meteor F.8 in camouflage markings, plus many aircraft scattered around the airfield in various stages of scrapping/re-cycling.

Several of the Swifts remained in Yorkshire and ended their days at the RAF's Fire School at RAF Catterick later in the year.

The weather stayed fair and the light was reasonable, so the photo sortie was exciting and enjoyable. All three of us were "snapping" away without any security restrictions. This was the final part of the visit and we thanked PO Dale and bade farewell. We were able to walk to Church Fenton Station and pick-up a train to York to catch our Newcastle train. While waiting at the Station we logged some Vampire T.11s of 1 FTS (Linton-on-Ouse) using Fenton for practice approaches

We had had a wonderful day out.

JB and I joined a later TGAE return visit on Sunday 28 May, using train/bus and a hitch along the B.1223, this time on a fellow TGAE members motor-bike, in relays – many thanks to Ralph if he reads this item. The Swifts had not been added to and were gradually suffering from further re-cycling. However, on that day, as well as the 60MU "victims", I have also logged seven Chipmunk T.10s of Leeds University Air Squadron (LUAS) and 9 AEF (Air Experience Flight). They were active and visible because it was a weekend. Examples are: WP915 of LUAS and WG478 of 9 AEF. Also seen were: the Church Fenton Station Flight Avro Anson VM 338 and several Provosts, Vampires and Meteors.

These sorties into deepest Yorkshire were helpful because within a few weeks I was living and attending school in Leeds, after a move from Newcastle because of my Father's work. So on arrival in Leeds I was already speaking the "lingo".

In the immediately following years, the early 1960s, I became a regular "spotter" at Church Fenton, over the fence, as the Jet Provosts arrived to equip the newly reformed No. 7 FTS (Flying Training School). 60 MU had moved to RAF Leconfield. But that is story for another day perhaps.

My most recent "spotting trip", to what is now Leeds East Airport, was in June to check on the changes noted on a visit in August 2020. It was interestingly busy with several light aircraft arrivals and departures, easily seen from a spot near the control tower. The "Fenton Flyer" cafe of 2020 is now the refurbished and more aspirational "Fenton Café and Grill" with terrace and picnic tables and the new terminal building is dominated by a car show-room full of top-end motors. So while you are eating your avocado wrap, at the Grill, you can ponder buying a "Maserati" to drive home.

LEEDS/BRADFORD NEWS

Well once again we find ourselves at the end of another year. The Airline Industry has made a slow recovery, but things are no where near the pre Covid levels of passengers, and profit. This of course not only affects the airlines, but airports, travel agents, and many others who depend on the industry for their livelihoods. Let's hope the progress to get to a "normal level" continues through 2022. As always I would like to take the opportunity to wish all members a merry Christmas, and a happy, aviation filled New Year. Once again I would like to Thank all those who attend our informal Wednesday meetings at the Multiflight Café, for their superb company and banter. Long may it continue.

Jet2 has reported a pre-tax loss of £206 million for the half-year ended September 30th. This is a significant increase on losses of £119 million recorded for the same period last year, at the height of the Covid-19 pandemic. Sales eevenue did, however, increase 43 per cent to £430 million during the six-month window. Although seat capacity for the period increased by 86 per cent to 2.68 million, average load factor fell to 57 per cent. The operator found it harder to fill planes to 'amber' destinations, primarily popular high-volume leisure destinations. Customers remained anxious such destinations could quickly be changed to 'red,' meaning enforced quarantine on return to the UK, Jet2 said. Philip Meeson, executive chairman of Jet2, said: "Although first half losses are greater than last year, given the limited number of Green destinations operated throughout the period and the fragile consumer confidence surrounding amber destinations, we have been satisfied with the positive financial contribution achieved, supported by our quick to market, flexible operating model."He added: "The dissolution of the green and amber lists from October was particularly heartening, as were the changes to the UK government's testing requirements for passengers returning to the UK. "As a consequence, forward bookings for winter 21/22 have been markedly stronger and average load factors much improved. "At present, on the assumption of a continued unhindered flying programme, we anticipate seat capacity for winter 21/22 will be approximately 11 per cent less than winter 19/20."

AIRPORT NEWS

East Midlands has announced that Ryanair will operate 130 flights per week from the airport in Summer 2022. The move will see East Midlands become one of the Key airports in Ryanairs UK network with flights to 31 European destinations being available from April. Destinations include the popular summer hot spots of Alicante, Barcelona, Lanzarote, Malaga, Mallorca, Rhodes and Tenerife.

Manchester Airport will become the first in the UK to have a direct feed of sustainable aviation fuel (SAF) thanks to a partnership between Manchester Airports Group (MAG) and Fulcrum BioEnergy (Fulcrum).MAG - the owner of Manchester, London Stansted and East Midlands airports - has signed a memorandum of understanding with Fulcrum, which will support the development and delivery of SAF produced at a new waste to fuels biorefinery, in Stanlow, Cheshire. As part of the agreement – backed by business secretary Kwasi Kwarteng - SAF will be supplied to Manchester Airport through a pipeline that already runs between Stanlow and the third largest gateway in the UK. Fulcrum is a pioneer in the conversion of non-recyclable residual wastes into sustainable fuels. The new biorefinery, Fulcrum NorthPoint, is part of wider plans to establish the north-west as the leading producer of SAF in the UK. The partnership will also work to support a sustainable recovery from the pandemic, promoting green skills and jobs across the country. Neil Robinson, MAG airspace change director, said: "This really is a landmark moment in our journey towards a decarbonised aviation sector."By working towards a

future supply of SAF, direct to Manchester Airport via existing pipelines from a local refinery, we're making sustainable operations accessible for airlines based here."

AIRLINE NEWS

Brussels Airlines has launched a new colour scheme. The new brand identity includes a new version of the Brussels Airlines signature red and blue colours, now a deeper red and a darker shade of blue. The dotted "b", which today adorns the tails of its fleet, makes way for 9 dots of different sizes in the form of a square, to represent the diversity of its customers, its destinations and its employees. No dot is alike. The updated logo also makes use of a new, more modern type font. The two words of the brand name are now stacked, with the word "brussels" gaining more importance with its larger size to emphasise the airline's Belgian identity. The new aircraft livery, shows a zoom on the dotted logo on the tails, a fresh white body and a continuation of dots in different shades of blue and grey. However Not everyone is happy with the introduction of the new Brussels Airlines logo. Gazeta.pl, , a Polish online platform who's logo is identical to that of the new tail logo made the following remarks on the airline's Facebook page.

"Hi Brussels Airlines! We like your new logo, great minds think alike! J We are sure our business leaders will work it out, but since we are some sort of logo twins, let"s get to know each other. We'll start we are Gazeta.pl, 20 year old Polish news portal with millions of readers. We see you are into planes or something"!

Carpetair, who occasionally visit LBA, with one of their fleet of 2 Fokker 100's, have just acquired an Airbus A.319. The aircraft c/n 3041, will be registered YR-ABA, and was formerly with Easyjet as G-EZBK.

Flybe has announced that Birmingham Airport will be its new company headquarters and first new crew base. Among the first UK airlines to be certified by the Civil Aviation Authority since Brexit, Flybe will serve key regions across the UK and EU. Operations are scheduled to begin in early 2022. Birmingham Airport's Diamond House will be the location of the company's new HQ and operations centre, in a move that is expected to create approximately 200 direct new jobs in the Birmingham and West Midlands region over the next three years. "Our entire fleet will be comprised of theDe Havilland Aircraft of CanadaDash 8-Q400, which is a fast turboprop-powered aircraft that can complete short journeys almost as quickly as a regional jet, but with lower CO2 emissions," Chief Executive Officer Dave Pflieger said in a statement. He added that this was in line with a key focus from day one on environmental sustainability but gave no further details as to the number of aircraft involved. An estimated additional 400 direct jobs will be created nationwide during that same time frame.

Flybe chief executive, Dave Pflieger, said: "We are thrilled to be partnering with Birmingham Airport (BHX), the city of Birmingham, and the mayor of West Midlands to make BHX the location of our new headquarters and first crew base. "It was an ideal choice for us due to its great people and highly skilled workforce, its central UK location, and the fact that Birmingham Airport is a global travel hub where local and connecting customers have access to over 150 worldwide destinations. "This announcement marks the culmination of over 12 months of dedicated hard work by all involved, and it would not have been possible without the support of the CAA and the UK government."Nick Barton, chief executive of Birmingham Airport, added: "Flybe's announcement that Birmingham has been chosen to become the headquarters for its launch next spring is fantastic news for our region's connectivity needs, and it will bring with it some great new employment opportunities."

Jet2 has launched its summer programme for 2023 from six UK bases. (It does not include LBA at this time) The operator has put its programme on sale earlier than ever before. The programme includes over 135 weekly flights to Canary Islands, over 150 weekly flights to the

Balearic Islands, almost 200 weekly flights to 14 Greek destinations and almost 120 weekly flights to Turkey during peak times. Trips to Spain, Greece, Turkey, Italy, Cyprus, Croatia and Portugal. With flights and holidays to the sunshine going on sale from Belfast International, Birmingham, Bristol, East Midlands, Manchester and London Stansted, the company will be making further summer 2023 announcements over the coming weeks. This includes further UK bases to go on sale as well as the launch of leisure city destinations.

AIRCRAFT NEWS

Embraer has announced a family of concept aircraft which it hopes will help the aviation industry achieve the goal of net-zero carbon emissions by 2050. Dubbed the Energia family, the four concepts of varying sizes incorporate different propulsion technologies – electric, hydrogen fuel cell, dual fuel gas turbine, and hybrid-electric. TheEnergia H2 Gas Turbine (E50-H2GT) is expected to seat between 35 and 50 passengers. Embraer is evaluating each for its technical and subsequent commercial viability. The Energia Hybrid (E9-HE) is a nine-seat aircraft with a hybrid-electric powerplant and read mounted engines. It's expected to reach technological readiness in 2030.Meanwhile, the fully electric Energia Electric (E9-FE) is also set to carry nine passengers but will feature aft contra-rotating propeller is expected to be ready by 2035.

De Havilland Aircraft of Canada Ltd. has announced that it would begin decommissioning its Toronto facility after it completes Dash-8-400s currently under its production lines. De Havilland says production work will restart following the confirmation of collective agreement extensions on Oct. 26 by unions who work at the Downsview site. De Havilland says it will store the decommissioned equipment while it reviews future production opportunities. De Havilland Canada says it continues to have an optimistic outlook on its future and the future of the Dash 8 program and plans to be ready when demand for new aircraft recovers from the COVID-19 pandemic. The company says its goal is to resume production at a new, undisclosed site as soon as possible and that its pause in production is a prudent measure that reflects current industry conditions. The current Downsville site was sold by Bombardier in 2018.

The world's only civilian Transall C-160NG was destroyed in a crash on November 3, 2021, at Dolow airport in southern Somalia., EY-560 (msn F-233) was operating a cargo flight fromMogadishu, reportedly carrying humanitarian supplies. After landing on the unpaved strip in Dolow, the 1985 vintage aircraft caught fire and burnt beyond repair. No fatalities were reported among the two crew members. The aircraft, previously registered as TL-AAW in the Central African Republic, was owned by Flying Tiger Oversize Cargo from Australia (70%) and Kenya's Wilken Group, the owner ofWestwind Aviation (Kenya) Newton Osiemo, the Director of Wilken Group, explained that the ownership of the aircraft was subject to a court case in Kisumu, Kenya. The judges served an order prohibiting the transfer of the aircraft out ofKisumuuntil the dispute had been settled. However, on March 9, 2020, the aircraft was flown out of Kisumu. Wilken Group denied having any knowledge about the aircraft's current ownership, registration, or operations. Osiemo underlined that the Kenyan court had issued arrest warrants for two Flying Tiger Oversize Cargo directors and the pilots who flew the C-160NG out of Kisumu. The warrants remain in effect, he added.

OTHER NEWS

British Airways and Virgin Atlantic joined forces on the 8th November to celebrate the reopening of the United States to fully vaccinated UK nationals. In a show of unity, the pair took to the skies in a synchronised parallel departure from London/Heathrow.Flight BA001 – the former moniker reserved for Concorde – and Virgin flight VS3, both operating Airbus A350-1000s, left the London hub at 8.50am this morning bound for New York/JFK.The return of transatlantic

travel comes more than 600 days since the US travel ban was introduced. Both companies campaigned fiercely for the safe return of transatlantic travel to ignite economic recovery. Sean Doyle, British Airways chairman and CEO, said: "[Today] is our moment to celebrate the UK-US reopening... Transatlantic connectivity is vital for the UK's economic recovery, which is why we've been calling for the safe reopening of the UK-US travel corridor for such a long time. We must now look forward with optimism, get trade and tourism back on track and allow friends and families to connect once again."Shai Weiss, Virgin Atlantic chief executive, added: "Together with British Airways we are delighted to mark today's important milestone, which finally allows consumers and businesses to book travel with confidence. "The US has been our heartland for more than 37 years and we are simply not Virgin without the Atlantic. We've been steadily ramping up flying to destinations including Boston, New York, Orlando, Los Angeles and San Francisco, and we can't wait to fly our customers safely to their favourite US cities to reconnect with loved ones and colleagues."

Grant Shapps, the UK Government's secretary of state for transport, commented: "This historic event marks a significant moment for the aviation sector. Transatlantic travel has long been at the heart of UK aviation, and I'm delighted to see flights return in time for Thanksgiving and Christmas."VS3 – using G-VJAM (c/n 336) – departed runway 27L at the facility, while BA001, G-XWBG (c/n 432), took off from the parallel 27R.
