FLIGHT REPORT

BRITISH AIRWAYS BA 2159 London Gatwick - St. Lucia 7-1-20 Boeing 777 G-VIIO

I approached my first long haul British Airways flight, not expecting to be impressed with the service. I was pleasantly surprised when this was not the case. The entertainment system was comprehensive, offering a good variety. I enjoyed an episode of Faulty Towers, The Psychiatrist to be exact. The one where Basil utters the immortal lines "So you are two Doctors. How is that ? Did you take the exam twice ? Back to the flight: A bar service was offered, shortly after take off. The meal was the traditional chicken or pasta choice. I chose the chicken, accompanied by mashed potato and vegetables, salad, roll, cheese and biscuits and a cream dessert. Wine had previously been distributed. Later during the flight ice cream was offered and a sandwich and small chocolate bar before landing. Tea. Coffee and soft drinks were available throughout the flight. An on time arrival, concluded a very smooth trip. My only criticism would be, that ten abreast seating on a Boeing 777 equals narrow seats and aisles. These were bearable but not comfortable. Flying time was 8 hours 53 minutes.

Overall score: 7.5/10

BRITISH AIRWAYS BA 2159 St. Lucia – Grenada 11-1-20 Boeing 777 G-VIIU

The flight to Grenada was a continuation of the Gatwick-St. Lucia service, with a change of crew. Upon entering the aircraft, there was that untidy appearance in the cabin, seen at the end of a long flight. It appears that the aircraft are cleaned and refuelled at Grenada. The new crew then fly the aircraft back to Gatwick. A short 28 minutes trip, saw us land on time. A drink of fruit juice was given to passengers, before take-off.

Overall score: 7.5/10

LIAT LI 772 Grenada – Barbados 16-1-20 ATR-72- 600 V2-LIC

The ATR-72 600 series is a remarkable aircraft, offering comfortable seating with above average legroom. Better still, it is very quiet, with only a whisper from the engines and no fuselage vibration whatsoever. I could have believed I was flying in a jet. A complimentary soft drink service was provided, during the 42 minutes flight. The view from my window seat was very good. The only down side to the service was the lack of an apology for being around 1 hour late, due to the late arrival of the incoming aircraft.

Overall score: 7/10

BRITISH AIRWAYS BA 2154 Barbados - London Gatwick 20.1.20 Boeing 777 G-VIIY

For no obvious reason, we departed around 30 minutes late. Once under way, I once more enjoyed the entertainment system which displayed the aircraft's height and direction of travel, amongst other features. During the flight we step climbed to 39,000 feet. I started watching Britain's Got Talent Champions and became hooked. Especially when my favourite act, Stavros Flatley appeared. A bar service was offered early in the flight, together with wine for the hot meal. This was of a good standard of quality and quantity, as on the outbound flight. A period of dozing followed, before A light breakfast was served prior to landing, around 01.30 Barbados time. We arrived at Gatwick at 06.25 local time, 30 minutes late, after an 8 hours 6 minutes flight. This was longer than average, in view of the lack of a tailwind. The service was all that I could have expected. My only criticism being the narrow seats and aisles.

Overall score: 7.5/10

Halfpenny Green Aerodrome (Wolverhampton Airport) 14 August 2019

My next stop after leaving Netherthorpe was a rather round-about journey down to Halfpenny Green thanks I think to my SatNav seemingly taking into account the time of day and prevailing road situation and like Netherthorpe the prevailing weather conditions were wet, very wet !

Another first visit for me too and a PPR request which was replied to by Brian Rawlings the Airport Operations Manager who I met in Unit 9 opposite the control tower and easily found by following the signed directions from the car park as well as the painted line on the floor. Once I had signed in , donned my hi-viz and briefed by Brian I was free to roam with the only restrictions being no hangar access and view from the doors only and no access to the area beyond Air Midwest were the PDG helicopter base is .

Apart from the PDG enclave which is 'new build' the majority of the buildings in use date back to the airfields wartime use as a flying training airfield , opened in 1941 as RAF Halfpenny Green and what remains of the communal and dispersed sites can still be seen to the south beyond Crab Lane opposite the main airport entrance . Jet2 s, and ex O.K. Airlines, Boeing 737-800, G-DRTY, made its 1st flight since its arrival last year. The aircraft positioned across to Manchester on February 27th. Boeing 737-800, G-DRTM, entered service at Manchester on the 20th February, the Aircraft was acquired from Air Europa The entry into service of the ex Thomas Cook A.321's is imminent as we close for press. G-HLYF has been painted in full Jet2 Holidays colours, and delivered to Manchester on the 12th February from Bournemouth. The aircraft was to make a tour round the U.K. bases (including Leeds/Bradford) on February 28th. as a CAA certification flight, but the planned tour was cancelled due to adverse weather conditions.

AIRPORT NEWS

Heathrow has received a blow to it's plans for a 3rd runway after he court of appeal has ruled a government decision to grant permission for the third runway was illegal. A case against government approval for the scheme was brought by environmental groups, councils and the mayor of London. They argued the plan to develop Heathrow was in conflict with environmental commitments made by the UK. Judges agreed and found the government had not followed UK policy when backing the expansion plans.Officials had a duty to consider the Paris climate agreement, which seeks to limit global warming. It was this "legally fatal" to the Heathrow expansion policy that it did not take those climate commitments into account, the judges said.

However, they added a third runway could go ahead in the future, as long as plans fit with climate commitments.Responding to the decision, a Heathrow spokesperson said: "The court of appeal dismissed all appeals against the government - including on "noise" and "air quality" - apart from one which is eminently fixable. "We will appeal to the Supreme Court on this one issue and are confident that we will be successful. "In the meantime, we are ready to work with the government to fix the issue that the court has raised. "Heathrow has taken a lead in getting the UK aviation sector to commit to a plan to get to <u>net zero</u> emissions by 2050, in line with the Paris accord."

The **Manston** Kent International Airports deadline for the decision on the proposed reopening and development has been extended until May 18, 2020, the UK's Parliamentary Under-Secretary for Transport, Nusrat Ghani, told parliament on January 16. The statement concerned an application made by River Oak Strategic Partners (RSP) in July 2018, for the proposed reopening and development of Manston as a cargo hub serving the wider London catchment area. RSP acquired the site for £16.5 million in July 2019, wants the airport to be considered as a nationally significant infrastructure project. To enable further information on a range of issues to be provided by RSP and other interested parties before the Secretary of State's decision, the deadline has been extended by four months until May 18, 2020.In the response to the Under Secretary's statement, River Oak said: "While frustrating, the delay is not unexpected - the last five decisions on DCO applications have all been delayed and none have yet been made."The airport closed in 2014, with the last commercial flights, a KLM Royal Dutch Airlines (KL, Amsterdam Schiphol) service to Amsterdam Schiphol, operating until April that year.

Teesside will see a significant increase in flights this summer season, thanks to Eastern Airways expansion plans to increase its presence at the airfield. According to press releases issued by Eastern and the airport, the flybe. franchise operator will deploy three aircraft - one 50-seat Saab 2000 and two 29-seat Jetstream 41s - to Teesside to operate the following new routes:

- London City, 2x daily, launches April 27;
- Southampton, 2x daily, launches March 9;
- Dublin Int'l, 6x weekly, launches March 9;
- Belfast City, 6x weekly, launches March 9;
- Cardiff, 5x weekly, launched February 10;
- Isle of Man, seasonal service, launches May 30.

Eastern's existing service from Teesside to Aberdeen Dyce, flown for the last 20 years, will also see an increase in weekly frequency. To help ensure reliability, an engineering base will be created at the airport to serve the aircraft operating the new Eastern routes. Overall, Eastern's commitment will add 185,000 seats each year, more than doubling the number of available seats through Teesside. Tony Burgess, Managing Director of Eastern Airways, said: "Eastern Airways is one of the longest-serving airlines to fly from Teesside International serving the critical corporate oil and gas market with flights to Aberdeen. We're delighted to now be strengthening our ties with the airport and branching out to bring enhanced connectivity to some new city destinations for business and leisure travellers. I'm sure these flights will be popular and we are continuing to look at how we can further develop our network for all regions."Ever since we brought the airport back into public ownership, one of the biggest and most frequent questions we've been asked from businesses and local people has been when will direct flights to London return," said Tees Valley Mayor Ben Houchen. "For too long, we've lacked this most basic connection, which is why I'm delighted to announce today's new services which will bring the Tees Valley even closer to the capital with a twice-daily service. This isn't job done, this is the next stage in our 10-year rescue plan to secure the future of

Teesside International. In fact, it's only the first phase of Eastern's multi-year commitment, with plenty of opportunity to expand and increase flights in the future."In addition to summer season charter flights to Palma de Mallorca and Burgas, the airport's only other scheduled flights alongside the Aberdeen operation is an 18x weekly KLM Royal Dutch Airlines (service to Amsterdam Schiphol,.

flybe. has been talking to its airport partners over its unpaid landing fees, a sum thought to run into millions of pounds, according to a report in The Sunday Telegraph. These discussions took place after the UK government granted the airline more time to pay its outstanding £106 million. Air Passenger Duty (APD) bill and offered a potential state loan - although both are yet to be formalised - to keep flybe, in the air. It is understood that the airport landing fee talks have been led by Mark Anderson, Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of Connect Airways, which owns flybe., at some of its biggest bases - namely Birmingham Int'l, Glasgow Int'l, Aberdeen Dyce and Southampton. While many affected airports would be supportive of helping the ailing carrier, the landing fee deferrals could also be detrimental to their own finances, given the scale of flybe, operations at some of the facilities. At UK airports such as Southampton, Exeter, Belfast City, and Newquay, the airline commands 90%, 85%, 79%, and 74% of weekly frequencies, respectively. However, Manchester Int'l and Birmingham are the carrier's biggest operations in terms of capacity, with the carrier offering around 20,000 weekly seats each at both airports. A Birmingham Airport spokesperson said: "flybe. is an important carrier to us and the Midlands region but we do not comment on commercial terms concerning any of our airlines," The airline ended Embraer E-195 operations on February 24, 2020, having retired G-FBEK on that day. The 11 year old regional jet operated its last revenue flight as BE845 from Edinburgh to Birmingham Int'l on February 24, 2020. It was then ferried to East Midlands The aircraft was the last of fourteen E195s once operated by flybe.

Loganair have taken delivery of its first of two ATR72-600s, G-FBXA, on February 12, 2020, ahead of the type's commercial debut planned for March 2.The Scottish regional specialist will start deploying the new type on March 2 on an 8x weekly service between Aberdeen and Sumburgh. After March 29, 2020, it will use the aircraft to operate from Aberdeen to Sumburgh (16x weekly), from Edinburgh to Kirkwall (12x weekly) and Sumburgh (2x weekly), and from Glasgow Int'l to Kirkwall and Sumburgh (daily each).

Ryanair has suggested to Boeing that new B737MAX-10s could be part of a compensation package for the losses suffered as a result of the near year-long global B737 MAX grounding. Rvanair Chief Executive Michael O'Leary said during a guarterly earnings review According to Reuters, O'Leary said he does not expect talks to advance to the point where an actual order size is discussed before the B737 MAX is recertified. A potential order for the B737 MAX 10, which can seat up to 230 passengers, would mark another upgauge for Ryanair. The Irish LCC, which so far exclusively operates 189-seat B737-800s (and a single B737-700 mostly for executive travel), has a firm order for 210 B737-8-200s, including 135 directly from Boeing and the remainder from lessors. The airline has already acknowledged that it does not expect any B737 MAX before the Winter 2020 season. The MAX 8-200 requires a separate type certificate which is expected to take another two months after the B737 MAX is ungrounded. Under its original schedule, Ryanair hoped to operate fifty-five B737 MAX during the Summer 2020 season. The LCC refused to give a specific figure regarding its estimated losses or demands for compensation from the Boeing.O'Leary added that realistically, Ryanair could take deliveries of up to eight B737 MAX per month once the type is certified. This would translate to around 50 units in the carrier's fleet for the peak Summer 2021 season.

Titan Airways is planning to add three P2F-converted A321 freighters with the first unit

currently undergoing conversion at Singapore Seletar airport, Cargo Facts has reported. The UK ACMI/charter specialist has been operating in the freight market since its foundation in 1988. It currently operates two B737-400(F)s. In mid-2019, it announced plans to also add A321 freighters, although at that time it did not provide further details. The first A321 for Titan Airways, G-DHJH (msn 1238) is a 19.8-year-old airframe previously operated by Thomas Cook and was ferried from Lasham via Heraklion, Sharjah, and Chennai to Singapore Seletar over the course of December 19-25, 2019. Commercial Director Alex Harrington said that despite the carrier's plan to transition to an all-Airbus passenger fleet with the replacement of B757-200s with A321-200neo aircraft, the cargo fleet will initially continue to include both A321P2Fs and B737-400(F)s. Eventually, however, the airline plans to also focus on Airbus freighters.

AIRCRAFT NEWS

Boeing and Embraer have welcomed the unconditional approval of their strategic partnership by the Administrative Council for Economic Defence's general-superintendence in Brazil. The partnership has now received unconditional clearance from every regulatory jurisdiction with the exception of the European Commission, which continues to assess the deal. "This latest clearance is yet another endorsement of our partnership, which will bring greater competition to the regional jet marketplace, better value for our customers and opportunities for our employees," said Marc Allen, Boeing president of the Embraer Partnership.Unconditional clearance has now been granted in Brazil, United States, China, Japan, South Africa, Montenegro, Colombia, and Kenya. "Brazil's approval of the deal is a clear demonstration of the pro-competitive nature of our partnership," said Francisco Gomes Neto, president and chief executive of Embraer. "It will not only benefit our customers, but also allow the growth of Embraer and the Brazilian aeronautical industry as a whole.

"Boeing and Embraer have been in discussion with the European Commission since late 2018, and continue to engage with the Commission as it proceeds through its assessment of the transaction. "We have been productively engaged with the commission to demonstrate the procompetitive nature of our planned partnership, and we look forward to a positive outcome." Allen said. "Given the positive endorsement we have seen from customers across Europe and the unconditional clearance we have received from every other regulator who has considered the transaction, we look forward to securing final approval for the transaction as soon as possible."The planned strategic partnership between Embraer and Boeing comprises two joint ventures. The first is made up of the commercial aircraft and services operations of Embraer (Boeing Brasil – Commercial) in which Boeing will own 80 per cent and Embraer will hold 20 per cent. The second joint venture will promote and develop markets for the multi-mission medium airlift C-390 Millennium (Boeing Embraer – Defence) in which Embraer will own a 51 per cent stake and Boeing will own the remaining 49 per cent.Former Air France Airbus A380 registered F-HPJB is carried out its final flight to Knock, Ireland on February 20th , where it will be scrapped. The aircraft flew from Paris CDG to Dresden, Germany on January 2nd and was flown to Knock, Ireland, where it will be dismantled for second-hand spare part market. The scrapping operation will be performed by Irish Aerospace company EirTrade Aviation. The F-HPJB was a mere 10 years old, delivered to Air France in February 2010.

OTHER NEWS

The outbreak of the new virus threatens to erase \$29 billion of this year's revenue for global airlines, mostly for Chinese carriers, as travel crashes worldwide, according to the International Air Transport Association. The trade group for global airlines has stated that the virus causing COVID-19 has the potential for causing a 13 percent decline in demand for Asian carriers this year. The contraction comes at a time when Asian airlines' sales had been growing, the group

said.Global air traffic will be reduced by 4.7 percent for the year, marking the first overall decline in such demand since the financial crisis of 2008 and 2009, the airline body said in a statement. How profits will be affected was still unclear, it said. The estimates foresee a scenario where COVID-19 has a "V-shaped impact," similar to what happened during the SARS virus outbreak in 2003, with a sharp dive followed by a quick recovery, according to the association. The virus, which began in China late last year, has sickened more than 75,000 people in China, Some 2,000 people have died in China. More than 1,000 cases have been found outside mainland China. International airlines including British Airways, Germany's Lufthansa, Australia's Qantas and the three largest U.S. airlines have suspended flights to China, in some cases until late April or May. Cathay Pacific asked employees to take three weeks of unpaid leave to help it weather the crisis.Travel restrictions inside China and fear of the illness have devastated demand for domestic flights in the fast-growing China market. Many nations are warning people not to travel to China, or barring travellers from China, especially from the Wuhan area, at the centre of the outbreak.

People around the world are also voluntarily scaling back travel, while some governments and health experts are encouraging people to stay indoors not only in China but also South Korea and Japan to avoid getting infected. "These are challenging times for the global air transport industry. Stopping the spread of the virus is the top priority," said Alexandre de Juniac, the association's director general and CEO. "This will be a very tough year for airlines."Analysts at Cowen, a U.S. investment bank and financial services company, noted the airline industry body might be underestimating the impact on Asia travel outside of China, noting the recent reports of dozens of cases in South Korea. "While still relatively small, and too early to tell if it will spread further, we see this as a material negative data point on the global containment of the virus," the Cowen report said.

The United Kingdom Air Traffic industry is celebrating 100 years since the world's first air traffic control tower was commissioned. The tower, built by the UK government, was erected at the then main airport of London of Croydon. The building itself was to be called the "Aerodrome Control Tower," which didn't just signify the building's purpose, it also spelled the terminology that we still see today. With this tower, built in 1920, the first controllers, known as Civil Aviation Traffic Officers, offered basic traffic, location and weather information to pilots over the radioWhen traffic demand started rising for air travel, the dozen or so daily flights in service were tracked using radio-based navigation and plotted on paper maps. In our post-industrial digital world, today's air traffic systems are managed by computers with screens showing up-todate information about an aircraft's position at any given moment in real time. Currently, NATS, the UK's air traffic control provider, handles over 8.000 flights per day, a number equivalent to 2.6 million flights per year. Commenting on the centenary was Juliet Kennedy, the Operations Director for NATS, who emphasised how important the history of air traffic control has become: "We've come a long way since the first controllers in terms of the amount of traffic we handle and the tools we use, but the motivation to harness the latest technology to help make flying safer and more efficient remains at the absolute heart of what we do." Last year. NATS was able to introduce real-time satellite tracking to improve the safety and environmental performance of flights across the Atlantic as well as using Artificial Intelligence at London Heathrow to cut weather delays.
