Interesting facts

In 2019 LBA had the **15th best performance in the UK** *compared to 2018* [of the Top 20 Airports in 2019] **-1.13%** and was the UK's 15th busiest airport with 3,992,209 passengers. Five years ago LBA was the 16th busiest airport.

In 2019 Charter Passengers were 1.15% of the total passengers. In 2018 it was 3.67%

Aircraft Movements decreased by 7.85% compared to 2018

There was an decrease in passenger movements of -5.64% in 2019 compared to 2018. The figure for 2018 was 29746

There were 318,138 Domestic and 3,673,845 International Passengers. The domestic passengers decreased by 9.34% compared to 2018 and International decreased by 0.34%.

In 2019 there were flights to 78 different international destinations (Over 200 Passengers), compared to 74 in 2018. Alicante was the most popular followed by Dublin, Malaga, Amsterdam, Palma, Tenerife, Faro and Arrecife.

In 2019 there were 6 different domestic destinations, with the most popular being Belfast City followed by Heathrow, Southampton, Newquay, Jersey and Guernsey

The freight figure for 2018 was 0.41 Tonnes compared to 2018 which was 3 Tonnes

'PURA VIDA' by Dreamliner....

Pura Vida' is a Costa Rican expression meaning 'Simple Life' or in more everyday use 'Everything's cool' or 'All's good'. So, looking forward to sampling this my family and I found ourselves at Gatwick Airport in mid-February awaiting our flight to this beautiful Central American country we had been looking forward to visiting for some time.

Our incoming aircraft (from Barbados) was a little late so we departed about an hour behind schedule. (But hey, what's an hour?). Our holiday was a package with TUI and so we found ourselves aboard their Boeing 787-8 'Dreamliner' G-TUII flight TOM76 en-route to our destination, Liberia Airport in Guanacaste Province, Costa Rica.

This was our first time on the 787 and our seats were in row 32 towards the rear of the aircraft. We paid a little extra for more legroom, but we found them very comfortable and well worth the money.

There had been storms over the Atlantic all week which had resulted in some record West to East crossings, but of course going the other way meant a longer flight time, which we were told would be around 11 hours 40 minutes.

Despite the length of the flight, the excellent seat back entertainment (over 40 movies on demand with Rocketman, Bohemian Rhapsody and Downton Abbey watched) and a very efficient and friendly food and drink service (from an all Scottish cabin crew), meant that the time passed very quickly.

Our route took us across the central Atlantic with the first land sighted being Cat Island (which is part of the Bahamas). Onwards across central Cuba, Grand Cayman and making our Central America landfall over the Mosquito Coast of Honduras. We then flew across Lake Nicaragua, with spectacular views of its island volcanoes before coming out over the Pacific Ocean and a left turn into Costa Rica and our approach to Liberia.

Liberia Airport is a small, but modern airport serving Guanacaste, Costa Rica's most northern province. It is one of the country's main tourist regions, so the airport has a fair number of flights per week, mostly from the USA and Canada. The only European operators being TUI and KLM.

As we taxied in I noted quite a number of biz-jets on the general aviation apron. Probably a dozen or so, but I was unable to read of any of the registrations. The airport was generally quiet this Monday afternoon with the first thing noted being Sunwing's Boeing 738 C-FWGH. This aircraft may be familiar to readers as it was based at LBA during a summer season not many years back. However, whilst waiting in the immigration queue a roar of engines drew my attention to the windows where '1718' a Lockheed HC-130H of the US Coast Guard was arriving.

As we came out of the terminal to board our coach to the hotel, N33292, Boeing 738 of United, N815SY a Boeing 738 of Sun Country Airlines and TI-BGB a Cessna C208B Grand Caravan of internal airline SANSA were seen.

A 40 minute coach trip and we arrived at the RIU Guanacaste. An all inclusive resort hotel on the beautiful Matapalo Beach, which would be our home for our next 14 nights. I wasn't sure

During the time we were there the following US and Canadian airlines were seen from poolside and beach. United, American, Alaskan, Sun Country, Delta, Southwest, Jetblue, Air Canada Rouge, Air Transat, Westjet and Sunwing.

After a few days settling in we headed out on our first excursion which took us out to the rainforest to look for Sloths. (We found some). Our route however took us past the airport and we discovered by the roadside a small

where we were in relation to the airport until we were heading to dinner and the roar of jet engines above our heads caused us to look up and see an aircraft on approach passing right over the hotel. This turned out to be the evening Alaska Airlines flight inbound from Los Angeles.

The next morning when we found our place by the pool it became clear that the hotel would be quite a good spot to watch incoming aircraft as they made their turn to start their approach over the bay and this brought many of them right over us. I had brought my camera and 70-300mm zoom to photograph



compound containing a number of aircraft on display. An unidentified Cessna and crop-duster type sat alongside MSP002 a DHC-7B Caribou formerly operated by the Costa Rica Security Police. We didn't stop but I managed a couple of snaps through the coach window as we sped by.



Noted across the airport by the terminal were the previously mentioned USCG C-130 and with it was Lockheed P-3B Orion, N741SK. This aircraft is operated by US Customs and Border Protection and was based there flying out over both the Caribbean and Pacific to undertake anti drug smuggling patrols.

A few photos were taken through the bus window of the above aircraft and others and I later was able to glean the regs of some bizjets from the images taken.

Back to the hotel for a week or so and a chance to watch and photograph some more of the airliners on approach as well as see the odd flyovers. Not too many aircraft were trailing but a few flights were seen from airlines such as Aeromexico, Avianca, LATAM Chile, COPA Panama, Interjet and Volaris.

A few locals were seen flying over the beach including Robinson R-44 TI-BET and Cessna T206H TI-BEC. Also, on a couple of days Guatemalan registered King Air TG-COC was about, doing calibration work at the airport.

Whilst looking at Flightradar 24 one evening I noted another US Customs P-3 arriving at the airport and as we were on another excursion the following day I hoped to see it. We set off the next morning to Lake Arenal and its Volcano and passing the airport I was pleased to see N741SK, Lockheed P-3AEW+C (with the AWACS type radome) parked up. I managed a photo (of sorts) from the bus window.

Time passed only too quickly and so we found ourselves back at Liberia Airport checking in for our flight home. A bit of time to kill allowed me to log and photograph (albeit through the terminal window) a few aircraft belonging to American, Sun Country, Air Transat and SANSA. Then it was time to board TOM77 our flight home and this time Boeing 787-8 G-TUIE. Another nice flight and we got some rest overnight before some 10 hours later arriving at Gatwick and onward (eventually) to Leeds.



On checking when we arrived home and getting everything on to the database I found I had 'made' over 100 airframes in Costa Rica alone, not to mention some seen at Gatwick. Not bad for a 'non-spotting' holiday!

Costa Rica is an incredible country full of wonderful scenery and landscapes and amazing wildlife. If you ever get the chance to go I heartily recommend it. Until then 'Pura Vida'....

Commercial news....

LEEDS/BRADFORD NEWS

As the coronavirus continues, LBA lost it's few remaining scheduled flights, and now is only operating 2 days a week. Most of these 2 days as will no doubt be covered elsewhere, we may as well revert back to RAF Yeadon, as most of the movements are R.A.F. aircraft carrying out practice approaches!!

Aer Lingus Regional, whose flights at LBA are operated by Stobart Air, announced they were only operating internal Irish flights. The last flight to Dublin operated on the 24th March.

On 24th of March, Eastern withdrew their LBA to Southampton service G-MAJU left on the EZE to Southampton, and never returned, positioning to Eastern's Humberside base instead. Jetstream G-MAJD, which had been receiving attention at Multiflight also positioned back to Humberside on the 24th.

On the 28th March, British Airways announced it was to suspend its LBA to Heathrow service until at least May 1st.

On the 31st March, KLM operated their last service into LBA, until at least, 4th May, leaving LBA with no scheduled services whatsoever.

On Tuesday 7th April, the airport issued a notice saying, "Due to the current situation surrounding Covid-19" it would only be operating Tuesdays and Wednesdays during the hours of 0700 to 1500, until further notice.

On the positive side (well possibly with all that's going on), Laudamotion are due to commence a weekly Sunday service from Palma, on 7th June. The flight is on behalf of mother company Ryanair, using A.320's

Mondays and Fridays Pisa and Malta flights are also scheduled to be operated by Ryanair's, Malta Air division. So while still the usual Boeing 737-800's in the usual colour scheme, these will be Maltese registered.

Another retirement for Jet2, this time Boeing 757, G-LSAD, which departed Birmingham on the 25th March to Kemble.

AIRPORT NEWS

Heathrow closed one of its two runways from Monday 6th April following the collapse in aviation demand as a result of the coronavirus pandemic. The airport also temporarily closed two of its terminals In March passenger numbers shrunk by 52 per cent compared to the same time last year, as the UK entered lockdown. Many of the three million journeys that were made last month were repatriations, following travel restrictions across markets as well as the Foreign & Commonwealth Office's advice against all but essential travel. The situation is expected to continue, with initial forecasts showing passenger demand in April is set to decrease by over 90 per cent. In response, Heathrow will consolidate operations to terminals two and five over the coming weeks. In a statement, Heathrow said: "This is a temporary measure due to the

unprecedented impacts of the coronavirus outbreak and it will provide us with greater resilience and safety for our colleagues, passengers and cargo. "It should be noted that at this time we are facilitating significantly fewer flights due to travel restrictions around the world." A Heathrow statement added: "We are making this change as we believe that it is vital that Heathrow remains open so that critical repatriation flights and cargo services can continue to operate. "The airport is playing a crucial role in facilitating the supply chain of vital medical goods and food for the nation, with 41 per cent of the UK's pharmaceutical products being imported via Heathrow. "We can only remain open if we can continue to operate safely and this move to single runway operations will improve our resilience should we see a further Covid-19-related reduction in staffing levels either from air traffic controllers or our airfield operations colleagues."

London City Airport suspended all commercial and private flights in the wake of the coronavirus outbreak from the end of March. "At this point in this fast-moving and unprecedented situation, we think this is the responsible thing to do for the safety and wellbeing of our staff, passengers and everyone associated with the airport," explained a statement from London City.

Gatwick meanwhile has closed one terminal, and is been partially utilised as a drive-through testing centre for coronavirus cases in the UK. Stewart Wingate, chief executive, Gatwick Airport, said: "We are pleased to support the national effort against the spread of the coronavirus by allowing Gatwick facilities to be used as a vital testing centre for frontline health workers. "We have the space available at Gatwick to be able to host such a large-scale operation. "Alongside keeping the airport open to support repatriation flights, amongst others, we are happy to be able to support the NHS, Government and the country in whatever way we can."

Liverpool Airport passengers are in for a treat, as the airport from the 12th April, announced all scheduled passenger <u>flights</u> will operate from the XLR Executive Jet Centre. The move allows the airport to close the main terminal.

AIRLINE NEWS

British Airways suspended all its flights to and from London's Gatwick Airport on the 31st March amid the coronavirus pandemic. The airline has said it will continue to carry out essential functions such as maintenance, towing and cleaning in order to be ready to start up again effectively. British Airways added in a statement: "Due to the considerable restrictions and challenging market environment, like many other airlines, we will temporarily suspend our flying schedule at Gatwick. "We are contacting affected customers to discuss their options." British Airways has retired five more Boeing 747-400s during week commencing 13th April The earlier than planned retirement of the aircraft comes as a direct result of the Coronavirus pandemic which has grounded the majority of British Airways fleet. The aircraft are G-CIVH, G-CIVJ, G-CIVK, G-CIVL, and G-CIVN and which will be stored for sale or parting out.

Jet2 expect to incur costs of £109 million following the grounding of flights in the wake of the coronavirus pandemic. All operations at the airline and tour operator are currently suspended for an indeterminate period of time, though holidays from June 17th remain on sale.In the longer term, the company said it was unable to assess the costs related to Covid-19, as the impact and duration of of the pandemic remains difficult to determine. Jet2 said 80 per cent of employees based in the UK have been put on temporary leave of absence, in order to make full use of the grants available under the coronavirus job retention scheme offered by the

government. All staff, including directors, will also take a 30 per cent pay cut from now until September. In response to the cut in flight, the company has also cancelled all 12 summer-only third-party leased aircraft. On a more positive note, Jet2 said it had made a profit of between £265-270 million for the financial year ended March 31st, up 49 per cent on the previous year. Customers are still making bookings for late summer and winter this year, Jet2 said, with encouraging numbers choosing to rebook rather than cancel.

Lufthansa, will permanently withdraw six Airbus A380s and seven A340-600s, as well as five Boeing 747-400s, as a result of the Coronavirus epidemic. In addition, eleven Airbus A320s will be withdrawn from short-haul operations. The six A380s (from a fleet of 14) were already scheduled for sale to Airbus in 2022. The decision to phase out seven A340-600s and five Boeing 747-400s was taken based on the environmental as well as economic disadvantages of these aircraft types. With this decision, Lufthansa will be reducing capacity at its hubs in Frankfurt and Munich Furthermore, Lufthansa Cityline will also withdraw three Airbus A340-300 aircraft from service.

AIRCRAFT NEWS

Airbus has decided to postpone its plans to build a new A321 assembly line in Toulouse, France amid uncertainty brought about by the COVID-19 crisis. The expansion was announced in January as the demand for the aircraft increased in its Hamburg, Germany site, but with the last decision of the aerospace corporation to cut by a third the manufacture of the type, it has changed its initial plan. As a cost-saving measure, the assembly company will pause new investments as the cancellation also was announced a day after easyJet deferred a 24 A321 aircraft delivery at the request of its founder, Sir Stelios Haji-loannou. According to the company, the plan is still on the table, but it lost its priority since Airbus was forced to cut one-third of its single-aisle jet production.

OTHER NEWS

Just when things could not get any worse for most airports, Fort Myers Airport in South West Florida suffered a huge fire which ripped through a hire car parking area. More than 3,500 vehicles were burnt out by the blaze after it swept across the parking. According to reports, it took firefighters 18 hours to get the 15-acre blaze under control as they dropped water onto the burning cars from helicopters, as well as from trucks that rushed to the scene. Melinda Avni, Mitigation Specialist for Florida Forestry Service of Caloosahatchee, told the press that emergency services were called at round 5pm on April 3rd, with about 20 vehicles working at one time to get the fire under control. Ms Avni went on to explain how the brush surrounding the overflow area of the car park caught fire and helped to spread the fire much more quickly. she said: "By the time we had units on the scene, we had 100 cars on fire. We lost count after the hundreds."However, despite the size of the blaze, none of the airport's buildings were damaged.
