

The Newington Monoplane....Steve Langfield

THE NEWINGTON MONOPLANE, DID IT, OR DIDN'T IT, FLY?

The Newington Monoplane was designed and constructed by Thomas L Bell, a supervising engineer of the Newington Steam Trawling Co, and Edward M Ling, a motor engineer. Sponsors and construction was the responsibility of Ling's uncle, Mr Jackson, whilst John Work was appointed president of a subsidiary - Newington Monoplane Company. The aeroplane was built in Hull at works in Walton Street and Anlaby Road in 1909, the build was declared complete on 21st October 1909. The finished machine was exhibited at the Hull Royal Institute, it was then taken to Hedon Racecourse for trials. At Hedon the Monoplane suffered from mechanical problems, a broken crankshaft caused by an oversize propeller and damage caused by a bull during a period of outside storage. The Aeroplane was a tractor monoplane with a 'high' wing positioned clear of the fuselage and it was built with a boat like front. Power came from a three cylinder 40hp water cooled engine mounted well back in the fuselage and driving a broad Handley Page propeller on a long shaft. The Aeroplane had a wing span of 30ft 9ins, was 26ft 3ins long and weighed 600lbs. The Edinburgh Newspaper reported that Ling had also been working on a biplane but he had put that project on hold to concentrate on the Monoplane.

The Hull Daily Mirror of 28th September 1909 reported that Edward Ling was "leaving Hull today for Edinburgh where he is to make arrangements for his forthcoming flight across the Firth of Forth". He is quoted as having stated that he had the greatest confidence in his Monoplane. If successful he would win a £500 prize (£50,000 today) offered by Edinburgh Museum Gardens to the first British pilot to fly the 9 miles across the Firth of Forth in a British built machine. The departure must take place from the grounds of the Marine Gardens where a special stage for pilots was being constructed and accommodation was being laid out for spectators. Ling had fully intended to make the crossing across the Firth of Forth on 23rd October and when this deadline was missed he gave a new date of 6th November for the crossing. Between 28/10/09 and 25/11/09 the aircraft was based at Portobello Marine Gardens where it was prepared for flight on the skating rink. On 8th November the propeller broke. Ling had claimed that he had already made some excellent flights in the monoplane though these cannot be verified. Some trouble though was found in the ignition and a new ignition patented system by Sir Clive Lodge was being utilised. On the 19th November the Hull Daily Mirror reported that with Ling as pilot the aeroplane attained a 2 mile flight at Edinburgh. However the Scottish newspapers did not agree and on the contrary they stated that it never flew in Scotland. Whilst in Edinburgh another propeller was broken and part of it went through the roof of the skating rink. Possibly this mishap or another prevented the attempt to fly across the Firth of Forth and the Monoplane was returned to Hull for repairs at the end of November.



AEROPLANE AT SUNK ISLAND.

TO THE EDITOR OF THE "DAILY MAIL." SIR .-- A statement to the effect that "the aeroplane at Sunk Island is the property of a syndicate" appeared in an issue of the Hull "Daily Mail" last week, and I beg to contradict the statement.

Certain reports have also been spread abroad, which are damaging to myself, concerning the so-called "flying experiments" at Sunk Island. and I, therefore, take the opportunity of in-forming the public that I am in no way connected with these experiments or trials, and I may also add that I was perfectly unaware that the machine had been taken to Sunk Island for trials.—I am, Sir, etc.,

The map shows the position of the Sunk Island Airfield with Hedon to its north and the letter from Edward Ling which was published on 14th June 1910 distancing himself from activities at the Aerodrome.

Exactly what happened between November 1909 and May 1910 is not fully known though the aircraft had cost many hundreds of pounds to get it to its current state and it now appeared that money was becoming a problem. Ling's involvement ceased by May 1910 with Bell almost certainly becoming the lead for the project and he was seeking new backers. The Newington Steam Trawling Company, where Bell was an engineer, became involved and this is where its name, the Newington Monoplane, was acquired. Around 6 financial backers were on board around this time. Flight trials would take place soon after but at a date to be arranged. The monoplane was placed on display in Hull Central Hall from 10th until 14th May where the cost of entry was 6d. Its design was described as a combination of a Bleriot and an Antoinette. Great play was made of the aeroplane's Hull connections, the only part not made in Hull was its propellor. At the end of its time being exhibited its designers optimistically said that if this aeroplane met with success they anticipated a new industry springing up in the area.

On 10th June 1910 it was reported that an aerodrome had been built on land owned by George Vickerman at Sunk Island, Holderness. It was further reported that the Monoplane was now owned by a syndicate of 6 and was based at Sunk Island but they were very reticent with regard to their intentions. The syndicate was named the Newington Aero Club and the Sunk Island Aerodrome would only last only a few months. On 15th June 1910 the Hull Daily Mirror carried a letter from co-designer and builder, Edward Ling, in which he publicaly distanced himself from 'his' aeroplane and the syndicate now owning it.

The Hull Daily Mail of 18th June stated between the 13th to 17th June the Newington Monoplane was moved out of its shed at Sunk Island to have its engine tested. However, the ground on which it was being tested was very uneven owing to horses that had been grazing on it over winter and as a result the Monoplane's flimsy wheels received serious damage. Ling and Bell were in Hull court on 22th June being sued by Jessie Lee Osborne, a brass finisher, for unpaid wages for working with the pair on the Scotland trip though the case was dismissed. On the night of 28th/29th June thunderstorms blew in over the Hull area. A tent was serving as a shelter for the aeroplane pending trials and it was blown away. The aeroplane's fuselage was made of wood with metal fittings which was struck by lightning, damaging the wings and undercarriage. The wings were damaged to the extent that they had been torn from the fuselage. Two mechanics were sleeping nearby and had a miraculous escape. In a bizarre move local farmers visited Sunk Island to check on the damaged aeroplane and by this time between £500 and £600 had been spent on the project, (£50k to £60k today).

The Newington Monoplane was finally put out of its misery when one of the venture's backers attempted to fly it. As a result of his lack of experience the aircraft was wrecked when it careered out of control through a hedge. It is believed that for a number of years what was left of the Monoplane was kept at the rear of the premises of Thomas Bell's later venture, a motor garage and workshop located on Hull Road, Hessle.

Did the machine ever fly, I doubt it, had it done so there would have been wide coverage of such an event in the press at the time, rather than isolated reports that it had flown.

British Airways - An Airline and Its Aircraft Volume 1: 1919-1939 The Imperial Years

By R.E.G. Davies Published by Paladwr Press

This book was destined to be the last, by renowned aviation historian Ron Davies. He had previously written a series of airline histories, all published by Paladwr Press. They are classics of their time. Regretfully, Mr. Davies died before Volume 2, of the above title could be written.

However, this publication is a worthy account, not just of the pre-war British Airways and its antecedants, but the early history of British airline operations.

The story is breaks down naturally into bite size chunks, dealing with each airline and aircraft type, operating services during the 1919-1939 period. There are a lot of interesting facts to learn, but the pace is easy going. The text blends seamlessly with a large number of illustrations, photographs, maps, and charts. The illustrations, drawn by aviation artist Mike Machat are both delightful and evocative.

Just about every pre-war air route is mentioned in the text, around Britain, Europe and further afield. This includes the early operations to India, The Far East and Africa.

Services from airports long since closed, make good reading. Every pioneering airline is well documented, including Imperial Airways, Railway Air Services and the unfortunately named Spartan Air Lines. It seems there were even flights to Lundy Island, in the Bristol Channel, provided by Lundy and Atlantic Coast Airlines.

Although published some 20 years ago, the historic nature of the contents, makes this volume current and relevant today. In short, the book is a delight. Good clean copies can sometimes be found on Ebay, or at Collectors' Fairs. Investing a few pounds in one, would be money well spent.

LEEDS/BRADFORD NEWS

Last month I reported that unconfirmed reports suggested that KLM were to take back their Amsterdam service in house as oppose to using Eastern Airways aircraft. To add more credibility to this, it has emerged that KLM have announced they will wet-lease three Embraer ERJ-190s from HOP!(France) for 18 months, between October 2025 and March 2027.

AIRPORT NEWS

Heathrow has submitted its "shovel-ready" proposals for a 100% privately financed third runway, capable of flights taking off within a decade. An expanded Heathrow would give passengers more choice – at least 30 new daily routes, extra domestic connections and a better selection of flight times to the most popular destinations. Alongside more reliable journeys and cheaper fares through an expanded airline selection, terminals will be more spacious and accessible and flights quicker to take off, thanks to a once-in-a-generation redesign of the airfield. Once completed, Heathrow's plans would grow the UK economy by 0.43% GDP; add 50% capacity to the country's most valuable trading port – already enabling more than £200bn of annual trade – while keeping its global competitive edge.

The blueprint submitted to Government includes:

- A north-western runway up to 3,500m a design that already has Parliamentary support
- Increased capacity to serve up to 756,000 flights and 150m passengers
- A brand-new terminal 'T5X', expanding Terminal 2 and three new satellite terminals

The investment consists of three main elements: £21bn for the new runway and airfield infrastructure (up from £14bn in 2018 due to construction inflation), £12bn for new terminal and stand capacity – the brand new T5X – and £15bn for modernising the current airport through expanding Terminal 2 and ultimately closing Terminal 3. A third runway and supporting infrastructure can be ready within a decade, and the full investment across all terminals would take place over the coming decades. Heathrow's proposals include more choice and capacity on public transport, such as enhanced rail capacity and walking and cycling routes, reducing local and environmental impacts. A new road tunnel, plans for two dedicated parkways and improvements to the country's busiest bus and coach station will make it easier than ever before to reach the airport. The airport is already ahead of target on its decarbonisation journey, cutting carbon from flights by around 10% since 2019, and carbon on the ground by 15% and has plans to ramp up further its world leadership on the use of Sustainable Aviation Fuel (SAF). Heathrow's noise footprint has reduced by 41% since 2006 and all air quality monitors around the airport are meeting limits. A third runway and redesigned airspace will give communities and passengers more certainty and reliability on flight paths.

AIRLINE NEWS

Air France is planning to exit Paris-Orly airport 2026. It will however continue to operate Public Service Obligation routes from the airport. This move is part of a broader restructuring of Air France's domestic network. The airline will consolidate most of its domestic and international flights at Paris-Charles de Gaulle Airport.

Alaska Airlines will begin non-stop flights from Seattle to London Heathrow and Reykjavik. The services will commence in May 2026, using Boeing 787-9's, acquired from sister airline Hawaiian Airlines. The airline has also unveiled a fresh livery for the Boeing 787-9. The livery, which will only be featured on the Dreamliner, is inspired on the northern lights, and will first feature on an aircraft in January 2026.

EasyJet confirmed it is actively exploring the opportunity to operate from Heathrow if the third runway project moves ahead. This would mark the airline's first major operation at Heathrow, allowing it to compete directly with legacy carriers like British Airways. The airline supports £21 billion expansion for passenger and economic growth. CEO Kenton Jarvis said "Heathrow's expansion offers a rare chance for easyJet to operate at scale from the UK's primary airport". Heathrow plans to expand capacity to 150 million passengers annually, opening doors to leisure airlines and increasing competition. While easyJet welcomes the potential for increased access, others like British Airways worry about rising costs and reduced exclusivity. Many legacy carriers benefit from Heathrow's current slot scarcity, which helps them maintain high ticket prices and market dominance.

Jet2.com has announced the opening of a new multi-million-pound hangar at Manchester Airport, which will play a critical role in supporting the company's operations and future growth. The opening of the hangar follows the demolition of a previous facility on the site, followed by a full rebuild in collaboration with technical construction partner TSL, and took exactly one year to complete. The new hangar, which is adjacent to an existing Jet2.com hangar at Manchester Airport, covers over 6,300 square metres of floor space, and will allow Jet2.com's engineering and maintenance teams to work on up to three aircraft at the same time, and six aircraft across the two hangars, further enhancing the company's in-house maintenance capabilities. The hangar also features an Apprentice Training suite comprising of workshops and classrooms, which will support Jet2.com's Engineering Apprentices, with more than 30 now employed with the company. In line with its Sustainability Strategy, Jet2.com has also fitted solar panels to the roof of the new hangar to help meet the energy demand.

Jet2 Holidays and ITV TV and are teaming up for The Great Escapers, a brand-new travel series that sends some of ITV's biggest names off on their first-ever holidays together. Stars from Coronation Street, I'm A Celeb, The Chase and Loose Women will compete to plan the best day out for their fellow celebs, all while soaking up the sun in Greece, Spain, Portugal and Malta. Lufthansa are planning retire its remaining Airbus A340's after the 2025 peak Christmas holidays demand. However they may get a reprieve, as the retirement of this now rare airliner from Lufthansa service, is dependent on its new Boeing B787-9s – fitted with the airline's long-delayed Allegris business class – receive their seat certification in time, according to group CEO Carsten Spohr.

Ryanair will significantly expand its operations in Albania by opening a new base at Tirana Airport in April 2026, with three Boeing 737-800 aircraft. The move represents an investment of US\$300 million and will create over 3,000 jobs, including 100 new positions for pilots and cabin crew, strengthening the airline's presence in the country. The new base will increase Ryanair's market share in Albania and expand its network across Europe. By the 2026 summer season, the airline plans to operate over 450 weekly flights on 33 routes, including ten new destinations such as Birmingham, Dublin, Milan, Malta, Naples, Pescara, Poznan, Trieste, Turin and Verona. In addition, frequencies on nine existing routes, including Bari, London, Prague, Stockholm and Warsaw, will be increased to meet growing demand.

Vueling Airlines have been allocated IAG International Airlines Group's entire firm order for fifty B737 MAX aircraft. The order is broken down to twenty-five Boeing 737-MAX8's and twenty-five Boeing 737-MAX10's. The holding's chief executive officer, Luis Gallego, said during a quarterly earnings call that the long-term plan was to transition the Spanish Low Cost Carrier from its current all-Airbus fleet to B737 MAX aircraft. The airline expects to add its first three B737 MAX in the fourth guarter of 2026, with the remainder scheduled for delivery between 2027 and 2029. On top of the firm order direct from Boeing, IAG has purchase options for another hundred B737 MAX. Vueling's chief executive. Carolina Sandra Martinoli, said that detailed deployment plans will be revealed later, but the first B737 MAX will operate out of the carrier's main base at Barcelona El Prat. The current firm order would not be sufficient to replace Vueling's entire A320 family fleet, as the Spanish airline operates 141 aircraft. Gallego clarified that if the airline performs as planned, the entire transition would stretch through the early 2030s. "We have announced today that the fifty Boeing 737s that we have on firm orders. we are going to allocate to Vueling. The intention, for sure, is that at the end of the process we replace the whole fleet of Vueling with Boeing product, but that is going to be dependent on the performance of Vueling. If Vueling complies with the plan that we have, then the intention is to replace the fleet. This is going to be a long period because we are talking about a lot of aircraft. So we are talking about maybe six years for the process," he explained. The company anticipates incurring additional expenses during the transition, as it will temporarily operate a mixed fleet. However, Martinoli emphasised that the airline has a plan to contain the added costs.

Wizz Air boss, Jozsef Varadi has given himself two years to turn around the low-cost airline and win back investors after a run of setbacks, including a humbling retreat from the Middle East. Jozsef Varadi, who co-founded Wizz in 2003, aims to cement a recovery by mid-2027, he said, when the hangover effect from the failed Abu Dhabi initiative is through and extra shop visits for the geared turbofan engines powering Wizz's Airbus SE fleet should be complete."We need to see a drastic change of performance because by that time basically the GTF issue should be behind us," the 59-year-old chief executive officer said in an interview in London. "There is no worse scenario than being on the ground."

AIRCRAFT NEWS

Two Airbus A321neo aircraft just six years old are being dismantled for parts in Spain. In an unusual move, which highlights the depth of the aviation supply chain crisis. Both airframes, previously operated by IndiGo, have been acquired by aircraft aftermarket specialist Setna iO. The jets, delivered in 2019, feature high gross weight landing gear, advanced avionics, and Pratt & Whitney PW1133G-JM engines, which are in especially short supply. While typical A321neos can remain in service for decades, industry estimates suggest the value of salvaging these parts now exceeds \$50 million per aircraft. Flight data indicates the planes, registered OE-IHD and OE-IHH, logged under 20,000 flight hours each before being retired in early 2025. Analysts note that while their long-term lease potential was considerable, the immediate demand for engines and components likely tipped the balance in favour of parting-out the aircraft as a spares source. With engine shortages expected to persist for years, more relatively young aircraft could face a similar fate as operators and lessors look to maximize asset value in a constrained market.

Boeing has been cleared by The UK Competition and Markets Authority to go ahead with it's planned acquisition of Spirit AeroSystems without an in-depth investigation into whether the deal would be anti-competitive. The Authorities full decision is not yet available but will be published shortly. In 2024, Boeing agreed to buy back Spirit AeroSystems in a \$4.7 million all-stock deal aimed at improving quality control. In July 2025, Boeing also agreed to take over a portion of Spirit's operations in Belfast City, which was broken up, with the other part of the business sold to Airbus.

OTHER NEWS

As is what is expected to be the busiest summer holiday period the UK has ever seen comes to an end, the UK Civil Aviation Authority has published new research showing that just one in 10 passengers (10 percent) said they felt fully informed about their rights in the event of a flight disruption. The number of passengers passing through UK airports this summer is predicted to surpass the pre-pandemic 2019 figure of 23.8 million. The Civil Aviation Authority is helping passengers to be aware of their rights by publishing accessible guides on social media and also reminding airlines of their responsibilities to look after passengers if something happens to their flight. Selina Chadha, Group Director for Consumers & Markets at the UK Civil Aviation Authority said, "Flight disruption is often unavoidable in the complex global aviation system, but what our research shows is that there is a clear gap in what passengers expect from airlines, and what is currently being delivered. "When faced with disruption passengers need to know what they are entitled to, and airlines need to give clear, timely information. Airlines that recognise the importance of good communication when something goes wrong can transform loyalty-damaging experiences into trust building moments that reduce passenger distress." Other key findings from the research published today include:

- Nearly two thirds of passengers expressed dissatisfaction with communications and over half (57 percent) of passengers felt that airlines providing more detailed information during disruption would have improved their experience.
- First notification is a critical moment to get right, with nearly half (45 percent) of passengers being actively dissatisfied with how the disruption they faced was initially communicated.
- 57 percent of passengers wanted more information during disruption, and 56 percent wanted more frequent communication - only one third (34 percent) of passengers were satisfied with the frequency of updates they received from their airline.
- Passengers who are not satisfied with their communications are more likely to claim for some form of compensation or reimbursement, compared to those who are satisfied with their communications (36 percent of those dissatisfied with initial comms attempted to claim for compensation, versus 27 percent of those satisfied).
- SMS text is the preferred channel at first notification of delay for 64 percent of passengers (as it
 does not rely on connection to internet which many passengers abroad may not have).
- Despite 92 percent of passengers claiming to check flight status before arriving at the airport, 41
 percent found out about their disruption through airport speakers/boards.
- Nearly 1 in 10 (7 percent) of passengers who experienced a flight cancellation (not a delay) ended up cancelling their trip entirely.

Through its 'Know Before You Go' campaign, the Civil Aviation Authority is reminding passengers of the importance of being aware of their rights so they can claim what they are legally entitled to if something happens to their flight. To help passengers if their flight is disrupted, the regulator has produced a series of short, animated videos that are available online and on its social media channels.
